The Rector Writes:

'We are ambassadors for Christ; it is as though God were appealing through us, and the appeal that we make in Christ's name is: be reconciled to God'.

These words come from St Paul's 2nd Letter to the people of Corinth and have so far this Lent been a challenge to me! How do I in my daily ministry be an 'Ambassador for Christ'? How do I be a person who reconciles people to God? Because this is what God is asking me to do! To literally be a person who 'stands up for The Lord - who promotes Him, who talks about Him, who tells others about Him and who protects Him'. In much the same way as an Ambassador for a country will do for that country wherever they are sent in the world

In a very real sense these words from St Paul should be a challenge to all Christian people. All Christians are called to be Ambassadors - to promote The Lord, to share the Good News of what He has done for us. We are also called to be people of reconciliation - people who bring people together in a common cause - and our cause is The Lord Jesus Christ.

So as we continue on our journey towards Easter and the greatest act of Reconciliation that has ever taken place I ask you to reflect on these words from St Paul, and think about, pray about, how **You** can be an Ambassador for Christ and a person of reconciliation.

'We are ambassadors for Christ; it is as though God were appealing through us, and the appeal that we make in Christ's name is: be reconciled to God'.

HOLY WEEK AT ST CUTHBERT'S AND ST THOMAS'

Holy Week is, or should be, the most important week in the year for any Christian. It is a time when we think about the journey that Jesus made for us. A journey that would change the course of history for ever.

On **Palm Sunday** we remember that people welcomed Jesus: they shouted Hosanna! To the Son of David; and waved palm branches in welcome. The people were glad to meet him, and that is how it should be for us as Christians today – we should be glad to meet Jesus in our worship. We should be glad to know the person who loves us so very much. Our life should be one of gladness in meeting Jesus.

On **Maundy Thursday** we remember that Jesus had a meal with his friends, and through that meal, he told us that whenever we eat bread together and drink wine, he will be with us in a very special way. It is also the day that Jesus shows us what it is to be a servant to other people. That it doesn't matter how important we think we are, as Christians, we should always be ready to help other people. Jesus was the greatest — the Son of God — and yet he washed his disciples feet, thus setting an example for us all.

On **Good Friday** we remember that because he loved us so much, Jesus was nailed to a cross. He was put to death by people who didn't like him and who didn't understand him. And we still nail Jesus to the cross today, we still put him to death. We do it every time we say or think something nasty and horrible about someone else. Because when we do this, we let God down, we let other people down and we let ourselves down, and it means that Jesus died for nothing. Yet Jesus loves us so very much that he was prepared to die for us, and therefore, we should do our best in keeping him alive by the things we do and say.

On **Easter Day** we remember that Jesus rose gloriously from the dead, and by rising from the dead he shows us that all he had ever said was true. The light that had come into the world could never be extinguished – and that light is Jesus. And when he told the women in the garden to go and tell other people about what happened, he was also telling us to do the same. All of us are called to tell the story of Jesus and we are called to tell it by what we say and do, and by how we live our lives.

So as you get ready for **Holy Week** (and you will find details of the services we have planned in this magazine) remember what Jesus has done for you – remember the journey that he made for you, and come along and share that journey with others. **Holy Week** is the most important week in the Christian Year. It is a time when we remember that the history of the world was changed forever, and it was done by someone who loves us and who desperately wants us to journey towards him.

Halsall School Report: April 14

Admissions

- The school governors had 36 applications for reception places starting in September 2014. All applications have now been ranked according to the Admissions Criteria and the data returned to the LEA.

At present we have 150 children on the school roll. We have a limited number of spaces remaining but if you are interested in bringing your child to Halsall, please let us know. Class structures change annually depending upon numbers in each cohort, so there may well be opportunities.

School Budget

The school has a healthy budget and is determined to maintain the present level of educational provision. It's commitment to high quality teaching assistants, providing effective classroom support to individuals and small groups, remains very strong. This continues to have significant impact upon the progress and achievement of pupils.

Standards

Standards at the school remain high in comparison to both all schools nationally and similar schools nationally.

Hopefully, this year's top class will rise to the challenge and perform their very best in the 2014 SATS. There's still lots of hard work to be done and lots of revision over the Easter holidays needed.

Easter Competition

The children have been busy drawing and painting for the Easter competition. Hopefully, there'll be lots of lovely work to display in both the school and church.

There'll be winners for several categories: under 5s, 5-8, 9-11 and 12+. Well done to everyone who has taken part.

Special Days in School

The other week we held a special Artist's Day in school. The children learned all about patterns and animal structures. It was a fabulous experience for everyone. Many thanks to the PTFA for supporting this wonderful, learning opportunity.

- We've also held a book fair in school and raised over £250 to spend on new classroom literature. (fiction and non-fiction) That'll keep the children busy!
- In a couple of weeks, we are having a special MATHEMATICS PUZZLE DAY. The children will learn all about how to solve mental and physical puzzles and it should be another really memorable day. It should really get everyone thinking!

Parish Centre

The school is now managing the centre on behalf of the PCC.

We are hoping to renovate the parish centre's wooden flooring and carry out some painting work over the next few weeks and the Easter holidays.

We are also looking for a cleaner who can come into school early to clean the area before school on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. (2 hrs PW, £7 PH) If you are interested, please let us know.

Gardener's Corner

April at-a-glance

April is the month when the blossom is out in force with everything from flowering cherries to garden fruit trees all making a beautiful show. Mild April weather can make you think summer is here but sharp frosts can still catch you out. Be careful not to plant out tender plants yet unless you can cover with fleece. Enjoy mild sunny days – spring is just around the corner. Happy Gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Spring clean borders, keep on top off weeding & hoeing.

Feed roses, borders, hedges, trees & shrubs with a general-purpose fertiliser.

Treat moss & weeds & re-seed bare patches.

Plant or move evergreen shrubs.

Feed acid loving plants.

Prune winter jasmine and hydrangea; tie in shoots of rambling roses & clematis.

Wait for six weeks (if you can) after flowers of spring bulbs are over before cutting foliage down.

Towards the end of the month, plant dormant dahlia tubers outside.

Plant new alpines & top up scree beds or troughs with gravel.

Continue to sow hardy annuals outside.

Pot up cuttings of tender perennials taken last year.

Tidy up hedges & clip if necessary.

Plant first early, second early & maincrop potatoes.

Plant asparagus crowns & clobe artichokes.

Harvest the first overwintered spring onions.

Sow hardy herbs (parsley, chervil, coriander, fennel, dill & marjoram.

Plant strawberries.

Plant & tie-in a new grapevine.

Prune stone fruit trees if necessary.

Ventilate the greenhouse on sunny days but close it early to retain the heat at night.

Top-dress & take cuttings from big old plants.

Spring clean the pond.

Divide overgrown plants & put in new water plants.

Towards the end of the month start feeding your fish.

Watch out for

Slugs & snails on newly emerged perennials & vegetable seedlings.

Plants in their Prime

Flowering cherries. Prunus. Crab apples. Magnolia. Spiraea. Ribes. Doronicum.

Pulmonaria.

Pieris. Tulips. Fritiiaria. Primula. Viburnum. Brunnera. Camellia. Mahonia. Magnolia stellata.

Bergenia. Hellebores. Lamium. Polygonatum. Viola. Iris reticulate. Trillium. Erythronium.

Bellis daisies. Ranunculus. Winter-flowering pansies. Arabis. Aubrieta. Phlox. Saxifraga.



Barton before the First World War



In the Summer of 1914 England knew nothing of the turmoil and heartbreak which the next 4 years would bring. The way of life would change dramatically with the onset of the Great War touching deep even into sleepy rural villages like Barton.

Barton today gives the appearance of a residential backwater containing houses, a few farms and a nature conservation area. However, within recent memory Barton had a mission church, a chip shop, a bank, a smithy and a pub. The Barton Rose gueen fete came to an end in the 1960's and the mission was destroyed by a fire in 1965. Barton wasn't always so tranquil, in my published history of Barton (Lancashire History Quarterly vol 9, 2005) I narrate how the Industrial Revolution cut two huge scars in the Barton landscape, one to the east and one to the west. Firstly there was the digging of the canal in 1790 and secondly the cutting for the railway in the early 19th century. There must have been much hustle and bustle and to-ing and fro-ing as crowds of navvies, mainly Irish made their way along the rural lanes to work. They satisfied their thirst in the local pub and spent their money in the local businesses. The presence of the Irish was relatively peaceful but a little local difficulty resulted in one Irishman, Seamus Henson being followed up Station Road by 3 farm workers, 2 of whom were from out of town. One of them picked up a brick to cause the Irishman harm at which point his son intervened, he was six foot tall and almost as wide across the shoulders, which caused the farm workers to turn tail and run.

By the end of the 19th century life had become quieter in Barton again. The train ran a few times a day for passengers but mostly for freight. There was still the traffic of horses and hand carts making the journey up Smithy Lane to the wharf, on the canal side, to collect night soil from barges and ferrying it fresh to the fields, from the middens of Liverpool. There was new build in Station Road moving the population away from the original heart of the village around Barton House and Rock Farm. The Countess of Casteja owned most of the land, which she leased to tenant farmers but now she was allowing parcels of land to be leased for building. William and Robert Haslam built two houses near to the railway. The countess also leased land for the building of a mission church in 1895.

Before 1914 and the outbreak of war the biggest problem in Barton was the flooding of the fields. Farmers had to take oil filled pumps onto the moss to keep water from ruining crops. The blacksmith was kept very busy and William Melling was the man at the anvil. He had taken over from John Cave. James Bolt had a grocers and Thomas Shacklady a little shop on Station Road. Henry Sutton was the licensee at the Bluebell Pub and Edward Leadbetter was the station master. Among the farmers were Elizabeth Blundell, Richard Haslam, Thomas Rainford, Thomas Rimmer, James Sephton with his son also James, and there was Thomas Sumner and Richard Wright. Many of these men were exempt from the call up to war because they were vital to the food industry. Others however felt it was their duty to go. The ladies had proved even before the arrival of land girls that the farms could be run by women. Thus we had Elizabeth Bond and Alice Fazackerley running farms in 1899 and Elizabeth Stopforth also registered as a farmer in 1905. Mary Ackers continued to run the farm which had been registered by Betty Ackers in 1854

The first impact of the war on Barton was the increased need for food production, the pressure was increased on Farms and farmers to maximise production. Several local men were eligible for call up, one was George Charles who was the son of John and Mary Charles he was 25 in 1914. He worked as a railway porter at Barton station and he joined The Kings Liverpool Regiment in 1914. Sadly he was badly wounded and though he was ferried back to Dover he died on 21st December 1917. He had attained the rank of Lance Corporal and he is buried in Halsall churchyard. Richard Rimmer was a farm labourer, he was the grandson of Richard Winstanley and Mary who practised as tailors on Southport Road, Barton. He lived in Barton for a short time in 1911 with his grandparents because there was seasonal work. His mother and father lived in Liverpool. Richard was 18 when the war started and he joined the Kings Liverpool Regiment, First Battalion. On 8th August 1916 at the tender age of 20 he was killed at the Somme and is buried in France at Theipval. The news was relayed firstly to his mother and father, Richard and Ann Rimmer who lived in Lowood St in Liverpool.

In 1918 when the war had ended Barton had lost two lads who had association with the village. There were 10 or more men who were eligible for war service. However, ironically sixty per cent of records were lost during the Second World War when a Luftwaffe direct hit destroyed many of the First World War records. In 1918 at the end of the war the only obvious change in personnel was that now Fred Baxter was the stationmaster. Most of the farmers were still in 'situ' but the faces of many of the farm labourers had changed for ever.
