<u>The Dying:</u> Paul can be contacted at any time of the day or night in order to minister to the dying.



The Rector Writes

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Many people think that Easter is finished on Easter Day, but of course Easter only really begins on Easter Day and the season of Easter lasts right up until Ascension Day. A 50 day celebration to remember, to celebrate and to give thanks for Jesus' triumph over death and his promise of new life for all people!

The story of Holy Week and Easter, the story of struggle, of pain, of death and then of resurrection, is a story of love conquering all and also an example of just how far God will go for his people. But does this still have an impact on people today?

Some of you will say 'No! Not as much as it should anyway.' Some of you will say, 'Yes! Of course! It is an event that changed the world.' Yet others may not be bothered at all, which I think is very sad.

At times when, if some parts of the media are to be believed, the Church and the message it proclaims of Jesus Christ risen from the dead, seems to have become an irrelevance, then it was refreshing to read some interesting facts published recently.

Did you know for example, that two out of three adults in this country know what happened on that first Good Friday and Easter Day. Seven out of ten people know that it was Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus. 68% of the population know how many disciples were present at the Last Supper and 69% know that the stone was moved away from the tomb and more than half of the country know that it was good old St Thomas who doubted that Jesus had risen from the dead.

I think that it is important to remember that the Christian story still does make an impact on the people of this land. I have to say that I found it surprising (I didn't think it was as high as this) and re-assuring that seven out of ten people know the Easter story. It would be very interesting to know how many people know the chemical constituents of water or what gases make up the air we breathe. Probably not as many as seven out of ten, which is also surprising since we are constantly being told we live in a scientific age and that the age of faith has had its day.

So let us not assume that people know nothing about the Christian faith. They may have more knowledge than we think. But what needs to happen is that knowledge has to be led to faith. **Knowing** that Christians believe that Jesus was raised from the dead is one thing, but actually **believing** that for yourself is another. Believing in your heart that Jesus rose from the dead is something that changes lives and makes people different.

Really believing that because he loves you Jesus went through all he did in his earthly life for you is an amazing thought. But believing these things are what marks us out as the Body of Christ in Halsall, Lydiate and Downholland

So as we continue to celebrate Easter, the great story of joy and hope, let us make our prayer and praise for the risen Saviour something that is alive and sincere. So that others who **know** what Easter is about may come to **believe** and that we all may be strengthened in the faith of a God who loves us.

May God bless you all as you witness to the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus.



Halsall Primary School Report: April

Mothering Sunday

Thankyou to everyone who came along to celebrate Mothering Sunday at St Cuthbert's. It was a lovely service and the children performed wonderfully. They certainly brought a few smiles to the mums' faces and a few tears to their eyes.

Thanks to the school staff who came along on that Sunday morning to organise the performances and supervise the children. For so many staff to support the school in that way, shows fantastic commitment and its certainly appreciated by myself, governors and parents.

Admissions

As you will be aware, the School's Admissions Number is 20. This year, we had 45 applications for the reception class in September 2016. The Admissions Committee has now ranked these applications according to the school's Agreed Admissions Criteria and the information retuned to the LEA.

If parents do not gain an initial place for their child and they are committed to the Christian ethos of the school, governors would encourage them to follow the official appeal process through the LEA.

Some spaces are likely to be available in the school's reception class and the governors would hope to be sympathetic to those appeals.

Attendance

Halsall St Cuthbert's attendance figure compare very favourably with those of other schools. So far this year, attendance has been very consistent. During the autumn term 2015, we had 57 pupils who had 100% attendance. (not even a half a day off school in Sept, Oct, Nov and Dec) What a great achievement!

Unfortunately we still have quite a few children who are absent for holiday reasons. In most cases these absences have a negative effect upon children's learning and progress but it is something that we try to minimise through the effective staff deployment on their return.

Resources and Improvements

In recent weeks we have :

Improved signage around the school
Supplied classes with new IPADS
Installed external new lighting around the school
Cleared and improved drainage

And there's still lots to do!

Replaced fencing around the vegetable plot Repaired roofing

Sports

In recent months, Halsall School has had considerably success in Inter-School Sports competitions.

Our school beat St Michaels (Ormskirk) 2-1 in the final to win the Bench Ball Tournament. We also finished 3rd in the West Lancs Schools chess competition.

There's now a football tournament, cross country championships, a swimming gala and the composite relay race to compete in the next few months.

Staffing

Mrs Floweth is expecting her 2^{nd} child and she should be taking maternity leave before the end of the summer term. We are now looking for a temporary replacement for the year 2/3 class from September 2016.

Mrs Hannah Massam our Kidz Club manager is now on maternity leave. We wish her all the best with the arrival of her 2^{nd} child. She'll certainly be busy!

Mrs Debbie Hughes will manage the club in Mrs Massam's absence.

Welfare

We are looking for welfare assistants to provide daily, term-time supervision at lunchtimes. If you are interested in working with children and joining the team, please let us know.

SATS 2016

There are major changes in the end-of-year SATS for both key stage 1 and key stage 2. Staff are busy preparing the children to do their very best and give them that vital boost before they start secondary education. It seems however, that the government's expectations of exactly what an average 11 year old child should be able to do in writing, maths, reading and GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling) is totally unrealistic. Exemplification scripts to highlight work deemed "Below National Expectation" would certainly be judged by most teachers, educationists and parents, to be of a good standard. It is somewhat confusing. Is there a hidden agenda here, to set the children up to fail? We're not too sure. At the moment there is much confusion and we hope that "common sense" with prevail and the judgements can be amended.

Once again Halsall will be entering the Lancashire Best Kept Village Competition.

We are entered in the Champions Class so the standards will be very high but with a little extra effort we are sure we will be able to do well.

In order to help make our plans we have referred back to the Judges Report from 2015.

Here it is in full :-

Halsall Judges Report 2015

The village was generally tidy, well kept & litter free. However, the footpaths along both sides of the main road needed sweeping as they held a lot of debris from the overhanging trees & bushes. Private properties were well maintained but some of the commercial properties needed attention to either the building or the surrounds.

St. Cuthbert's Church was in excellent order with tidy, well cared for grounds & graveyard. The War Memorial was also in good condition.

The Saracen's Head was excellent with an attractive frontage & a pleasant beer garden. However, part of the car park was untidy. The bowling green at the side of the pub had some weeds in the gutter around the green & some of the shelters needed painting. St. Cuthbert's Primary School was in good condition but one of the signs was in need of repair -& there were a few weeds around the buildings.

The Memorial Hall, the playing fields & the play area were all tidy & litter free.

The owners of Manor House Farm had made considerable effort to maintain the site in immaculate condition; it was extremely clean & tidy

Overall Halsall is a very well kept village with just a few areas needing attention.

Well done to those receiving praise - especially Brian and Celia Webster from Manor House Farm on New Cut Lane for winning the Best Kept Farm in Lancashire once again.

If the few negative comments in the report can be taken on board and put right, we are sure we can do well.

We are already organising lots of jobs around the village and hope some of you will be able to offer some help Here are the dates we have planned so far -

- We will tidying in Bishops Walk one afternoon in the week commencing 18th April with the help of some of our schoolchildren. Adults very welcome too!!

NOW IN HALSALL

April at-a-glance

April is the month when the blossom is out in force with everything from flowering cherries to garden fruit trees all making a beautiful show. Mild April weather can make you think summer is here but sharp frosts can still catch you out. Be careful not to plant out tender plants yet unless you can cover with fleece. Enjoy mild sunny days — spring is just around the corner. Happy Gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Spring clean borders, keep on top off weeding & hoeing.

Feed roses, borders, hedges, trees & shrubs with a general-purpose fertiliser.

Treat moss & weeds & re-seed bare patches.

Plant or move evergreen shrubs.

Feed acid loving plants.

Prune winter jasmine and hydrangea; tie in shoots of rambling roses & clematis.

Wait for six weeks (if you can) after flowers of spring bulbs are over before cutting foliage down.

Towards the end of the month, plant dormant dahlia tubers outside.

Plant new alpines & top up scree beds or troughs with gravel.

Continue to sow hardy annuals outside.

Pot up cuttings of tender perennials taken last year.

Tidy up hedges & clip if necessary.

Plant first early, second early & maincrop potatoes.

Plant asparagus crowns & clobe artichokes.

Harvest the first overwintered spring onions.

Sow hardy herbs (parsley, chervil, coriander, fennel, dill & marjoram.

Plant strawberries.

Plant & tie-in a new grapevine.

Prune stone fruit trees if necessary.

Ventilate the greenhouse on sunny days but close it early to retain the heat at night.

Top-dress & take cuttings from big old plants.

Spring clean the pond.

Divide overgrown plants & put in new water plants.

Towards the end of the month start feeding your fish.

Watch out for

Slugs & snails on newly emerged perennials & vegetable seedlings.

Plants in their Prime

Flowering cherries. Prunus. Crab apples. Magnolia. Spiraea. Ribes. Doronicum. Pulmonaria. Pieris. Tulips. Fritiiaria. Primula. Viburnum. Brunnera. Camellia. Mahonia. Magnolia stellata. Bergenia. Hellebores. Lamium. Polygonatum. Viola. Iris reticulate. Trillium. Erythronium. Bellis daisies. Ranunculus. Winter-flowering pansies. Arabis. Aubrieta. Phlox. Saxifraga. Scilla.
