The Reader Writes

Well, not long now! The Christmas adverts have been reminding us for ages. Any day now the Summer 2017 holiday adverts are due on TV. I do find it hard not to get all sentimental at Christmas. There is something about it (whether it is the result of clever marketing, nostalgia or the Christmas story itself – or all three) that can make us feel cosy and warm.

But Christmas has been sanitised. From the hymn that tells us "the little Lord Jesus, no crying he makes" – really?? – to classical paintings and Christmas card images of animals looking lovingly on the baby Jesus looking comfortable in a clean, dry straw bed – again, really??

Surely the reality of a young, heavily pregnant Mary forced to travel about 90miles by dirt road from Nazareth to Bethlehem on a donkey before struggling to find somewhere to give birth amidst the animals was very different?

Add to that need for his family to flee Herod's infanticide of all boys under two years of age in and around Bethlehem to ensure the death of Jesus. This, of course, resulted in the loss of an entire generation of boys.

When ISIS invaded Mosul in the summer of 2014, Christians' homes were marked out with a symbol – the Arabic for 'N' (for Nazarene, or Christian). Like the baby boys of Bethlehem, they were marked out because of an association with Jesus, because, like Herod, ISIS are terrified of Jesus' world changing potential.

Incredibly Jesus escaped and he lived in Egypt until Herod's death. Many Christians escaped from Mosul and fled to Kurdistan. Though part of Iraq, Kurdistan speaks Kurdish, not Arabic, and has its own distinct culture.

Like the refugees in Kurdistan, Mary and Joseph wouldn't have known when (if) they would be able to go home. In fact when they did return to Israel, it still wasn't safe to go back to Bethlehem, and instead they went to Nazareth. For many refugees in Iraq, this is not the first time they've had to run. Many came to Mosul as refugees from Baghdad in the first place. They have no idea when they will be able to go home.

He knew what it was like to be a refugee but this part of Jesus' life often gets forgotten. But Jesus' early childhood will resonate with many Christians around the world this Christmas. According to the United Nations, there are over 21million refugees worldwide, and over half of them are under 18 years old. And many of these are Christians fleeing persecution.

In Matthew 25: 40 Jesus says that 'whatever you did for the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

When we see news footage of the refugees from Iraq, Syria and Afghanistan, let's remember the reality of their experience. How would we want the world to treat Jesus the refugee, if he were fleeing persecution today?

2016/1089/FUL – Malt Kiln Barn - Extension and remodeling of domestic ancillary outbuilding - re-submission of 2016/0627/FUL 2016/1145/FUL – 10 Moss Rd - Two storey side extension to residential property

2016/1152/FUL – 14a New Cut Lane - Variation of Condition No. 10 of planning permission 2014/0301/FUL to read "No development shall take place until a surface water drainage scheme and means of disposal has been submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The surface water drainage scheme must be restricted to existing run-off rates. The development shall be completed, maintained and managed in accordance with the approved details"

Halsall Christmas 1863 and Arthur Vaughan-Williams

Christmas was but two days away, on a grey morning, as Arthur Vaughan-Williams stood in the churchyard of Halsall church. Exposed on an outcrop, it took the full force of gales which roared from the Irish Sea across the flat open plain and today the wind was icy. He shivered in such a cold wind, a searching wind; that cut through the darning of Arthur's threadbare cassock. Life as a curate was not profitable. The earth was cold to the touch as he threw some frozen crumbs of soil onto the lid of the coffin of little Will Swift age 3.

The boy had brought joy to his mother's heart, he was so fond of music, singing along to folk songs and he even copied notes his dad had played on a penny flute. Such a loss, but this was the 11th youngster Arthur had buried since his arrival in Halsall in July 1863. Arthur was invited to be curate on the retirement from Halsall of the rector Richard Leigh. The new Rector Thomas Hollinshead-Blundell had made it clear that the curates do all the funerals and baptisms. The rector would officiate at the weddings, it was more in keeping with the squire like duties of a country vicar. These were usually pleasant occasions and often there was an invitation afterwards, some fine wines, food and plenty of country talk about hunting and shooting.

No, burials were a miserable business, but a chance for a curate to add to their meagre income and Arthur already had experience of that and it disturbed him that within his first few months he had to bury so many infants under 5 years of age.

Halsall was not a poor parish, its arable farmland was of the highest quality and its fine medieval church dating back to 1320 was testimony to a prosperous past. The poverty and hardship amongst the labouring folk in this area seemed so much less; relative to the squalor and disease of the slums in nearby Liverpool and Manchester. The crops from the farms in Halsall and the local market in Ormskirk provided fresh food, but despite this, infant mortality was high amongst farming workers. Almost half the children under 5 in farming families died of diseases such as influenza, scarlet fever, whooping cough and diphtheria. Moreover there were frequent epidemics of smallpox and measles. At this time there were no vaccinations and merely keeping sanitary conditions was hard enough with most water in the area coming from wells.

Arthur wanted to be a vicar in his own parish, being curate was in effect serving an

apprenticeship. As well as his clerical duties Arthur taught Scripture in the school on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Arthur also had a love of music and the church had a pedal organ, housed in a hastily erected gallery at the west end; however it had no trained choir and hymns were not sung with any great passion. Arthur attempted to put together a choir, to sing the many new hymns which were available from recent editions of 'Hymns Ancient and Modern', but there were few takers. The problem was commitment, harvest in Halsall was a long drawn out process which stretched from cereals in July to root crops in December. It was difficult to compete with demands on time and the church became so cold in the autumn nights for practice. Coupled to this Arthur knew his time at Halsall was limited, perhaps 12 months or more, but then he must move on, he did not want to be a perpetual curate. A good reference from Rector Blundell could help him to have his own parish. While the gravediggers moved in to close the grave on that 23rd of December 1863, Arthur wiped the dirt from his hands and gazed into the hollow eyed grief of the parents. As he watched them depart he thought of his own family far away in Bayswater London and was sad that he would not be spending this Christmas with them. Instead he would spend Christmas in Halsall and there would not be very much merriment at the big old rectory where he lodged with the rector. Thomas Blundell was single, but was due to wed in the new year, he had a couple of servants but it would be a quiet time. In previous years there had been much festive fun at the rectory when it was occupied by Rector Richard Leigh, he knew how to keep Christmas. Richard Leigh had a

family of ten and also employed ten servants and a German governess , he gave plentiful invites to villagers, who came in to wonder at the curious sight of a fir tree, decorated with candles and coloured ribbon, so popularised by Prince Albert.

Arthur trudged back into the church to extinguish the candles. He would occupy his time in the next few days rehearsing a small group of youngsters to sing carols at the Christmas service. A respite he hoped before the heart-breaking burials of infants began anew with the severity of the coldest months in the new year.

Arthur Vaughan-Williams left Halsall in July 1864, four years later he became Vicar of Down Ampney in Gloucestershire. He married Margaret Wedgwood in 1866 a great grand daughter of Josiah Wedgewood. His son Ralph became a gifted musician and arguably Britain's greatest composer since Thomas Tallis (1505-1585) with whom he made a crucial link across centuries in one of his greatest works*. Arthur died when Ralph was just 3.

In Halsall between July 1863 and August 1864 Arthur had officiated in 42 funerals of which 24 were children most under 5. He also performed 41 baptisms and 3 marriages.

.....

William and Ellen Swift lived in Trundlepye Lane and farmed 40 acres. After losing their son Will age 3, they lost James age 3 in 1874, Ann age 5 in 1874, Alice age 2 in 1876, Mary age 10 in 1877 and Margaret age 26 in 1888. William himself died 1890 age 61 and his wife Ellen in 1899 age 62. Their grave is close to the church path.



General garden tasks

Carry out lawn repairs if weather conditions allow.




