



This is an important day in the Life of all Christians. Both the Book of Common Prayer and Common Worship remind us that Ash Wednesday is a Holy Day - a day when all Christian people should gather to worship the Lord.

On Ash Wednesday there is the opportunity to receive the 'Imposition of Ashes' on your forehead.

What does this mean?

Well very simply at a point in the service - and it is optional - you are invited to come up to the altar rail and receive the cross - the sign of Jesus on your forehead. This is a symbolic gesture that reminds us of certain things:-

That we are sorry for our sins and wish to repent of them.

That through the cross we are sealed for Christ.

That through the cross we are redeemed and saved.

So at the start of Lent (Ash Wednesday) please join us in church as we start our journey towards Easter.

EXPLORATORY DRILLING/FRACKING FOR SHALE OIL AND/OR GAS IN HALSALL

<u>UPDATE</u>

The Parish Council has been advised by Tesla that the proposed seismic survey in PEDL 164 has been postponed until 2015. However Aurora Exploration (UK) Ltd. have applied to Lancashire County Council for an extension of planning permission (LCC/2014/0095) at Norris Farm, Downholland Moss Lane, Formby until May 2016, where exploratory drilling has already taken place in the green belt.

The present government is openly committed to fracking and, to assist it, they are proposing to change the law of trespass to allow the exploration companies to carry out horizontal drilling under your home without your permission. There is an official government consultation on the subject online at:

The governments' stance is that extraction of shale oil and gas will be up and running by the end of this year. They maintain that it is for the good of the country and that it will bring money to local neighbourhoods. David Cameron has said:

"Companies have agreed to pay £100,000 to every community situated near an exploratory well where they're looking to see if shale gas exists. If gas is then extracted, 1 per cent of the revenue – perhaps as much as £10 million – will go straight back to residents who live nearby. This is money that could be used for a variety of purposes – from reductions in council-tax bills to investment in neighbourhood schools. It's important that local people share in the wealth generated by fracking."

It should be noted that residents in New York State opposed fracking even though they were offered 12.5%. The reason for this was due to the low yield of oil from fracking (less than 100th of conventional wells) which meant very little benefits to the community to offset the risk of environmental/structural damage even though the US government had not withdrawn the rights to individual compensation.

Your Parish Council would like to collate residents' views before the seismic survey takes place next year and a very short survey is overleaf. Please can you tear out the page and drop it off at Halsall Garage or the Pharmacy.

EXPLORATORY DRILLING/FRACKING

HALSALL RESIDENTS' SURVEY

From the surveys that have been returned to date, all of those who responded had heard of fracking before the survey:

83% DO NOT consider that fracking is good for the country;

88% DO NOT want to see exploratory drilling/fracking in Halsall;

88% DO NOT consider that the cash offered would make up for the consequences of drilling/fracking and the damage to the landscape of Halsall;

80% would support the setting up of a group against exploratory drilling/ fracking in Halsall

The survey is ongoing and the Parish Council will continue to include the survey in the Halsall News and would urge residents who have not yet responded to do so either using the form in the Halsall News or online:

URGENT NEWS: LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL CONSULTATION

This is currently a joint consultation between Lancashire County Council, Blackburn with Darwen Borough Council, and Blackpool Council. LCC describe this as follows:

The three authorities are producing supplementary planning guidance for onshore oil and gas developments, to provide guidance on the implementation of adopted development plan policy as it would apply to onshore oil and gas exploration, production and distribution.

In other words, they are in the process of making decisions which will determine/expand upon how they will deal with planning applications for exploratory drilling and fracking under the existing Local Plan.

The Parish Council commented under the scoping consultation last year and a draft supplementary planning document has been prepared, which is up for comment (also a Scoping Consultation Outcomes Report, and a Screening Statement for Strategic Environmental Assessment) on the LCC website:

http://www3.lancashire.gov.uk/corporate/consultation/responses/response.asp? ID=259 The documents are also available in public libraries. <u>This consultation only runs</u> for 8 weeks from the 5 January 2015 to the 2 March 2015.

A recent email from LCC also mentioned the minerals and waste planning policy. This would presumably cover disposal of drilling/fracking waste. It is also on the LCC website:

We are still anticipating a visit from OFSTED as it's been 6 long years since our last inspection. In that time we've generally maintained standards well above the national average in all areas. (except for the blip in boys' writing last year)

We are very confident that this year, the standards reached by both our present year 6 pupils and the reception pupils will be extremely high and that attainment levels will be significantly above the national and LEA averages.

Gardener`s Corner

February at-a-glance

The first signs of spring are starting to appear if you don't mind going out to look for them! February is a subtle month with catkins and the first bulbs cautiously pushing their heads above the wintery earth, while keen gardeners desperately look for some real gardening to do. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Make new beds and borders

Finish off winter digging

Order plug plants



Prune certain types of clematis – refer to a good gardening book for exact advice

Renewal - prune old shrubs, deciduous hedges and climbers

Brush snow off conifers, large evergreens and hedges to avoid splaying or breaking

Move deciduous trees and shrubs (ideally do this in November or early March) Plant lily-of-the-valley crowns

Keep deadheading any winter flowering pansies or polyanthus in tubs and hanging baskets

Water and top-dress plants in year-round tubs and container grown herbs

Prepare soil ready for sowing, covering it with polythene sheeting to warm it up for early vegetables

Plan shallots and Jerusalem artichokes.

Prune autumn-fruiting raspberries now, and plant new canes between now and mid-march

Protect strawberries with horticultural fleece

Finish winter-pruning standard apple and pear trees

Ventilate the greenhouse at every opportunity, but water as little as you can get away with

Pot up stored dahlia tubers and lily bulbs

Spray fuchsias with water on fine days o start them back into growth

Chit potatoes if you didn't get chance last month

Take precautions to make sure your pond never freezes over entirely

Get-a-head

Prepare the greenhouse before the season gets fully underway –clean water storage barrels, watering cans, pots and seed trays, propagator and greenhouse glass

Plants in their Prime

Hellebores, Hamamellis, Viburmum, Mahonia japonica, Sarcococca, Skimmia japonica `Rubella, Clematis `Freckles`, Jasmine, winter- flowering pansies, Saxifraga apiculata, Daphne mezereum, Abeliophyllum distichum (white forsythia), Sempervivums

Bulbs – Iris riticulata, Crocus, Narcissus (varieties) scilla, Anemone blanda


