It is, I believe, important for all of us in this day and age to take some time for ourselves, to refresh ourselves and recharge our batteries and there is no better time for that than summer



Planning Applications:

2016/0440/FUL - 78A New Street - Replacement upvc windows 2016/0479/FUL - Land Rear Of, 14A New Cut Lane - Erection of 1no.new replacement dwelling (in lieu of No14a) and 1no. new dwelling, both with private rear gardens, in-curtilage car parking and served by a new access road – The Parish Council has asked that permission be refused.

2016/0480/FUL - 62A New Street - Proposal for 2 no semi detached dwellings and the conversion of the existing barns into 1 no detached dwelling including associated works following the demolition of the existing warehouse building.



Press cuttings about Halsall Church 1778-1951

The digitalisation of newspaper records has permitted an insight into some of Halsall Church's most newsworthy events. Whilst today local news tends to be reported by the local press, in the 18th and 19th centuries it was the wider press which picked up on interesting articles for their readers. This was because compared to today there was a lack of local communication, transport and the paucity of local journalists.

The first reference we have in the press is one by the Cumberland and Whitehaven Advertiser which reported on the 15th September 1778 that the Honourable Charles Mordaunt of Halsall Hall presented the Reverend Glover Moore (chaplain to the

Honourable Earl of Sefton) to the living of Halsall on the 17^{th} August. The living is worth £1000 per year. The Liverpool Mercury 13^{th} October 1815 announced the marriage of Mr Thomas Segar the youngest son of Mr Edward Segar of Barton to Margaret eldest daughter of John Howard. It added also that Thomas Parke was engaged to the Segar's third daughter. On the 14^{th} October 1859, Edward Segar had been to the forefront in projects to drain the moss and make it into farmland. The Liverpool Mercury reported that the congregation had subscribed to the enlargement and improving of the organ at Halsall Church, the work was completed by Rushworths and it was 'improved delightfully in tone'.

The Preston Chronicle on 22nd February, 1862 noted an addition to the burial ground in Halsall, which was consecrated by the Bishop of Chester. In 1867 matters at Halsall were reported as widely afield as Cheshire and Birmingham, when Adelaide, wife of the Rector, Thomas Blundell was involved in an incident with her ex Butler during the service at Halsall. It was alleged that she assaulted the man during the service and charges were pressed. On 22 July 1882 The Manchester Courier announced that the Reverend Francis Jephcott of Queens College Birmingham was licensed to be a Curate at Halsall. In 1884 the funeral of the Rev Richard Leigh, Rector of Walton was dealt with in the Liverpool Mercury, on 15th April. His remains were interred in a vault at the west end of Halsall Church. The Reverend FBH Blundell presided. The Morning Post, 18th October 1884 reported the funeral of the Honourable Mrs Blundell, wife of Colonel B H Blundell took place, Thursday last, her death occurring on 3rd October. The Reverend J G Leigh, the Reverend J Wood and Cannon Blundell presided.

The Liverpool Courier in June 1886 proclaimed the reopening of Halsall Church, after extensive renovations. with a special service led by the Bishop of Liverpool. The repairs are described as exhaustive and included the rebuilding of the porch and rebuilding of the north and south aisle walls. The church was reroofed and the level of the floor raised, with many tombstones being removed to outside the church. The church has been provided with oak pews and all the box pews removed. The ancient font has been refurbished and several new stain glass windows installed. A new hot water heating system has also been installed. All the works were carried out by Paley and Austin of Lancaster. The quote for work was £3000 but in fact the final figure was nearer £7000. Paley and Austin had restored the chancel in 1873 and repaved the church removing the graves of previous rector Nathaniel Brownlow and son to a position where they now reside next to the porch.

The Liverpool Mercury picked up on the 10^{th} meeting of the Historic Society of Lancashire and Cheshire in its edition 28^{th} March 1896. A paper on Halsall Church prepared by Henry Taylor and received by R D Radcliffe put forward that the construction of the present church commenced between 1260 and 1280 as evidenced by pillars and arches on the north side. Mr E Cox spoke with regard to early alterations and expressed his opinion that the church was the work of a south country architect.

The Cheshire Observer 19^{th} May 1900 remarked that the Rev Canon Blundell applied for a faculty to erect two stained glass windows, one in memory of his son Ltnt Blundell of the Grenadier guards who was killed at Belmont in 1899. The Lancashire General Advertiser on the 3^{rd} October 1906 reported on the funeral of Colonel Blundell CB and ex MP for Ince. In January the next year The LGA 24^{th} Jan 1907 notes the granting of a faculty at the consistory court for the erection of a new lectern in memory of Canon Blundell and his wife Adelaide. A stained glass window was also erected in his memory.

The Hartlepool Mail revealed, on the 22nd November 1910, that a coat and 50 shillings belonging to the Rev E Mather, a curate of Halsall church, was taken on the previous Saturday. Edward Woods who was wearing the coat, was captured on a bicycle on the road to Ormskirk by another curate, who gave chase on his bicycle. Woods was sent to prison for a month. Again a theft was the subject of the Liverpool Echo on 12th July 1918, when money was taken from the offertory box in the porch of Halsall Church. James Robinson aged 52 was caught on the Ormskirk to Southport road with 2 chisels in his pocket after £1 and 19 shillings went missing from the box. The case, it reports, is up for trial at Liverpool assizes. In 1921 Archdeacon Spooner was the rector and the Hartlepool mail enthused over the cricketing exploits of his son at Lords in its sport headlines.

In between times the Coventry Evening Telegraph on 20^{th} Sept 1915 related the death of organist and choirmaster William Jones . He had officiated as organist for over 60 years and for 50 years was Head teacher of the National School. He was 81 and a year previous he had celebrated his diamond jubilee receiving a handsome present .

The headline of the Lancashire Evening Post 18th April 1935 proclaimed "Ravages at Halsall" The presence of death watch beetle in the 600 year old choir stalls at Halsall Church outlined the damage and steps taken to treat the infestation. The headline ran:-

'Death Watch Beetle ravages choir pews which are amongst the finest carved pews in the north of England'. The Reverend E L Mather claims it was found just in time," though inspections of the roof rafters is needed as a precaution". Mr Dodd the church architect has been responsible for treating the pest'. The final article from the archives was another contribution by the Hartlepool Mail 12th March 1951 which commented that a local darts team from the Scarisbrick Arms across the road from the parish church had funded the lighting of the clock on the church. Perhaps during a long game many a head went to the window to take the time from the revered old timepiece.



Gardener's Corner

July & August at-a-glance

July is peak flowering time for most gardens, while August is the culmination of months of effort. The garden is a paint box of summer colour, herbaceous borders zing with colour, bedding plants are blooming fit to bust & hanging baskets are full to the brim & in full swing.

And if you fancy a change of scene, it's a great time to go garden visiting.

Summer is here – enjoy. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Raise the cutting height of the lawn mower blades during hot dry spells.

Avoid watering the lawn, except a new lawn in long dry spells.

Prune & deadhead roses.

Prune philadelphus & wisteria.

Clip privet & other fast-growing hedges.

Continue taking softwood cuttings of shrubs.

Cut lavender for drying.

Keep on top of deadheading plants & perennials.

Divide old clumps of bearded irises & replant.

Plant autumn flowering bulbs.

Sow main crop carrots, early peas, turnips, lettuce, radishes & spring cabbages.

`Stop` outdoor tomatoes.

Cut & dry or freeze herbs.

Tidy strawberry beds & grow spare plants from runners.

Harvest raspberries, redcurrants, blackcurrants & gooseberries.

Train a standard fuchsia.

Water & feed greenhouse plants more often now the weather is hotter & the containers are filling up with roots.

Provide more oxygen in ponds if necessary by thinning waterweeds or running a fountain.

Divide water iris

Watch out for

Cabbage white butterflies laying eggs on brassica plants.

Potato blight on potatoes & tomatoes.

Plants in their Prime

Cornus. Kousa. Cytisus. Deutzia. Phygelius. Spiraea. Yucca. Crocosmia. Echinops.
