The Reader Writes...

Paul, Glen and I write this article on a strict rota and it's my turn to write the July/August article. I was informed that it often reflects the holiday season so I sat down to write such an article but, given my diary and printing deadlines, I am writing this on Pentecost Sunday, the day after the third terror attack in England in as many months. I write this watching the re-scheduled Ariane Grande concert from Old Trafford on the television. In the face of the atrocities we have seen, you might ask what significance a pop concert could have. Well, as the Manchester attack was directed at largely children and young adults attending a concert, it's a great act of defiance to attend.

But what should be our wider response to the kinds of acts of terror we have seen vividly portrayed on our TV and on social media?

Obviously, such acts should be condemned and the full force of the law should be brought to bear on those responsible. But for most of us, it may be hard to see how we can influence our society on the scale required. And the truth is that you and I are unlikely to be able to prevent a hated-filled, misguided, disenfranchised terrorist who is prepared to die from committing an atrocity. What we can do is to prevent those acts of terror from destroying our way of life, poisoning our relationships, and undermining our freedoms. To allow fear, division and hatred to flourish is to allow the terrorists to have the last word.

And the warning signs that we have done that, that the terrorists have won would be the following:

- 1. We stop going about our normal business whether that be attending concerts, travelling as much, or avoiding crowds.
- 2. If we create scapegoats or alienate groups of people. The acts of terrorism have been created "in the name of" Islam. They are no more Islamic than the terrorist bombs in Northern Ireland and on the mainland from the '60s to the '90s (committed by "Protestants" and "Catholics") were Christian. Muslims are not the problem. Islam (like Christianity) is a faith of peace. If we treat Muslims as terrorists, we hit the wrong target, we store up further problems for our society and we deny the very fact that God is love.

Perhaps to lighten things up, I should have stuck with a holiday-related theme. If you're going on holiday, Godspeed, Shalom (Hebrew – the Jewish blessing meaning "peace") and As-Salaam-Alaikum (Arabic – the Muslim blessing meaning "peace be unto you").

School Admissions

We have 20 new pupils starting school in September. Several parents have opted to go to Appeal through the LEA and so this number may change depending upon the appeal outcome.

Parents who wish their child to gain a reception place in September 2018 are encouraged to sign the Worship Attendance Book at the end of the service. (please ask in church). This is vitally important, as only by reference to this book, can the governors confirm whether a parent's frequency of worship attendance meets one of the schools Admissions Criteria.

It is important to note that a child's attendance at the St Cuthbert's Church Sunday School is not one of the Admissions' Criteria and would not be of any advantage when the governors rank the applications in the spring term.

We await the results of the year 6 SATS and Key Stage 1 assessments and phonics screening. Hopefully all of our children will have performed well and reached their potential.

Gold Rose Noble



Visitors to the Heritage festival at St Cuthbert's in June will have had the opportunity to view the Church silver which was temporarily on display on the altar from the bank vault where it is usually stored. The silver comprises several ancient pieces and the donation of some of the pieces are documented on the elaborate Parish benefactor boards in the choir vestry.

One of the pattens, (a small silver plate), has a gold coin embedded in the silver. The story of this coin is quite remarkable because it was found under the pillar, between the nave and the Chancel arch during renovations sometime around the early1900's but we are not certain of the date. There were eleven other similar coins found with it all gold and all rose nobles. The history of the rose noble dates back to Edward III king from 1327-1377.

There is on one face a crowned King situated within a long boat. This coin was reproduced throughout the reigns of several monarchs and the coins found in the church are dated to Henry V second edition about 1416. The coins then are contemporary with the building of the church. We know that building of the present church began somewhere around the end of the 13th and start of the 14th century.

The plague commonly called 'the Black Death' occurred during the reign of Edward III in 1349 and killed nearly half of the population of Halsall including clergy and masons. Building stopped on the church, the Chancel was completed by the end of the century and the tower added early in the 15th century.

The question this poses is why were these coins deposited under the supporting column of the Chancel arch? Were they a thanksgiving for the survivors of the plague? Perhaps it was like good luck charm for the church on its completion.

Given the date they may well have been a thanksgiving for Henry V's victory at Agincourt 1413 which is still considered one of the most astonishing military victories. Henry 'en route' back to England achieved a victory over the flower of the French nobility by defeating 25,000 strong force with a dysentery ridden and exhausted army of barely 9000 English and Welsh.

Of the coins found 7 can today be seen in the British Museum. The Treasury paid the rector George Hardwick-Spooner the grand sum of 24 pounds 6 shillings in 1923 for these. The other 4 were auctioned at Sotheby's and raised 34 pounds, the church received 29 pounds 7 shillings for their sale. Today they would be worth at least 3000 pounds each.

Gardener`s Corner

July & August at-a-glance

July is peak flowering time for most gardens, while August is the culmination of months of effort. The garden is a paintbox of summer colour, herbaceous borders zing with colour, bedding plants are blooming fit to bust & hanging baskets are full to the brim & in full swing.

And if you fancy a change of scene, it's a great time to go garden visiting. Summer is here – enjoy. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Raise the cutting height of the lawn mower blades during hot dry spells.

Avoid watering the lawn, except a new lawn in long dry spells.

Prune & deadhead roses.

Prune philadelphus & wisteria.

Clip privet & other fast-growing hedges.

Continue taking softwood cuttings of shrubs.

Cut lavender for drying.

Keep on top of deadheading plants & perennials.

Divide old clumps of bearded irises & replant.

Plant autumn flowering bulbs.



Sow maincrop carrots, early peas, turnips, lettuce, radishes & spring cabbages.

`Stop` outdoor tomatoes.

Cut & dry or freeze herbs.

Tidy strawberry beds & grow spare plants from runners.

Harvest raspberries, redcurrants, blackcurrants & gooseberries.

Train a standard fuchsia.

Water & feed greenhouse plants more often now the weather is hotter & the containers are filling up with roots.

Provide more oxygen in ponds if necessary by thinning waterweeds or running a fountain.

Divide water iris.

Watch out for

Cabbage white butterflies laying eggs on brassica plants. Potato blight on potatoes & tomatoes.


