



NEW COUNCILLORS.

B Assheton, D Corfield, S Corfield, C Pyne and J Ridley were co-opted onto the Council at an extraordinary meeting held on Monday 1st June. A full list of Councillors and contact numbers can be found towards the front of the magazine.

The new Councillors attended their first meeting on Wednesday 9th June and Borough Councillor Denise Hirrell also attended the meeting to introduce herself and take questions from Councillors and members of the public.

The Council would like to recognise the contribution to the community made by Maureen Mills during her time as Borough Councillor, particularly in the fight against fracking.

PLANNING

2021/0378/FUL — Warehouse to Rear, 94 Summerwood Lane - Variation of condition no 2 of planning permission 2018/0940/FUL to vary the approved plans.

2021/0474/FUL - Holly Farm Office, Plex Lane - Removal of Condition No 10 of Planning Permission 2020/0922/FUL to require a lighting scheme to be submitted.

2021/0534/FUL – 41 Renacres Lane – Single storey extension at the rear of bungalow.

2021/0592/FUL – Gregory House – Gregory Lane - Erection of 2200mm acoustic fence to front boundary – The Council has objected to this proposal on the grounds that it would have a detrimental impact upon the Conservation Area.

PARKING ALONG SUMMERWOOD LANE.

Cars parking either side of Summerwood Lane at school times and when funerals and weddings are taking place at St Cuthbert's are causing an obstruction and preventing large vehicles, including the emergency services from passing through.

Please use the Memorial Hall car park whenever possible.

NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL continued

PARKING ON NEW STREET NEAR TO THE JUNCTION WITH CARR MOSS LANE

This is creating a dangerous situation for cars trying to turn out of Carr Moss Lane as their line of sight is obstructed and we would ask that people refrain from parking close to the junction before a serious accident occurs.

PARKING ON CARR MOSS LANE NEAR TO THE JUNCTION WITH LINEKAR DRIVE

Once again the Parish Council would ask people to use some common sense when parking their cars and not to park so close to the junction as to restrict residents of Linaker Drive from being able to see oncoming cars approaching from both directions when exiting the drive.

PARKING ALONG SEGARS LANE AND NEW CUT LANE

Cars double parking and parking on pavements are causing problems along Segars Lane. Can residents please park in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through.

The Halsalls & The Irelands



After Henry VIII set up his own Church of England, the manorial lords, the Halsalls and the Irelands of Lydiate remained Catholic. The Irelands were a very influential family from 'the Hutt' near Halewood. They were established after William the Conqueror came to these shores in 1066.



At a later date they had marital links with the Halsalls and supported Halsall parish church financially. Their association is represented on the tomb of Sir Henry Halsall, in the chancel of the church, by the heraldry on his tomb. It is a chevron with three fleur de lys and is also depicted on the armour of his effigy.

Sir John Ireland married Margaret Halsall in 1381. There was also intermarriage between the Halsalls and other great families in Lancashire as far away as the Norris family at Speke, the Bold family in Churchtown and across to the Stanleys of Lathom. The Bold family were connected through the marriage of Thomas Ireland who married a daughter of Richard Bold and they also intermarried with the Halsalls and it is their Griffin on the Bold coat of arms which was over the west door entry to the grammar school on the south side of the church, but is now indiscernible because of erosion.

In 1563 Thomas Ireland held the advowson and was patron of the church. This was at an important moment because with the reforms under Henry VIII and Edward VI the village was reluctant to change to Protestant ways and needed a strong Catholic patron in place to resist change. The Ireland family remained important and became more so when Laurence Ireland built a Hall at Lydiate within the parish of Halsall at the end of the 15th century.

At the time of his death in 1566 Laurence held lands in Halsall and Aughton as well as Lydiate. William his heir only survived his father Lawrence by three years and was succeeded by his 18-year-old son Lawrence the third. When Lawrence died in 1609 his will showed that he only held land in Lydiate and Eggergate (now Eager Lane). He was buried in Halsall church.

His son Edward was considerably more wealthy and this may be down to his own astuteness or because of his marriage to Margaret another Norris from Speke Hall who was from a wealthy family. We must also remember that this was a time when penalties for being a Catholic reduced wealth and estates greatly. However Edward was careful and courted the established Protestant religion while remaining devoutly Catholic. He had built for himself the most opulent elevated pew in Halsall church which set him out as a man of means and influence. Edward died in 1637 and was buried within the church next to his father.

The pew which bore his father's coat of arms remained in the parish church for nearly 200 years afterwards but the influence of the Ireland family and Halsall families gave way to the Blundells and the Andertons. All that remains now of that famous pew is on a board in the vestry bearing the Edward Ireland coat of arms, an array of five fleur de lys surmounted by a dove.

Gardener's Corner

July & August at-a-glance

July is peak flowering time for most gardens, while August is the culmination of months of effort. The garden is a paint box of summer colour, herbaceous borders zing with colour, bedding plants are blooming fit to bust & hanging baskets are full to the brim & in full swing.

And if you fancy a change of scene, it's a great time to go garden visiting.

Summer is here – enjoy. Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Raise the cutting height of the lawn mower blades during hot dry spells.

Avoid watering the lawn, except a new lawn in long dry spells.

Prune & deadhead roses.

Prune philadelphus & wisteria.

Clip privet & other fast-growing hedges.

Continue taking softwood cuttings of shrubs.

Cut lavender for drying.

Keep on top of deadheading plants & perennials.

Divide old clumps of bearded irises & replant.

Plant autumn flowering bulbs.

Sow maincrop carrots, early peas, turnips, lettuce, radishes & spring cabbages. `Stop` outdoor tomatoes.

Cut & dry or freeze herbs.

Tidy strawberry beds & grow spare plants from runners.

Harvest raspberries, redcurrents, blackcurrents & gooseberries.

Train a standard fuchsia.

Water & feed greenhouse plants more often now the weather is hotter & the containers are filling up with roots.

Provide more oxygen in ponds if necessary by thinning waterweeds or running a fountain.

Divide water iris.

Watch out for

Cabbage white butterflies laying eggs on brassica plants.

Potato blight on potatoes & tomatoes.

Plants in their Prime


