

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Church Spire and Roof Update.....the story so far!

People in the village are aware of the work carried out to date on the emergency repairs and stabilisation works which were completed to enable St Cuthbert's to remain open. Whilst this work was always a temporary solution it has given the Church Council the time to develop fully the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) application and subsequent approvals from all of the relevant bodies eg, English Heritage, Central Church. The HLF approval process is in two parts, The Development Phase, which involves the appointment of all appropriate professionals and the drawing up and tendering of detailed plans and eventually, once all this has been accepted, the Delivery Phase. To date £52,000 has been spent on repairs and planning with the HLF providing £13,500 towards this. The balance has been found through the magnificent efforts by the village.

The great news now is that the HLF have finally adopted the plans submitted and given permission to the PCC to complete the repairs (the Delivery Phase) and this means that the work can start early June.

The HLF has now confirmed a grant of $\pounds 232,000$ which was the maximum available and leaves us to find the sum of $\pounds 70,000$.

The PCC has had to take the difficult decision to commit all of its remaining financial reserves to the scheme. However, this will still leave a shortfall to find and therefore the fundraising efforts will continue.

Some may question this decision and also why the spire cannot be left as it is following the 'making safe' work that was carried out.

The decision has been taken for the following reasons:

- The initial repairs (that were made possible by the generosity of the village) have made the building safe but are not a permanent solution. If the work is not done the spire will eventually have to be taken down, which will still cost a lot of money and which would not attract any grant funding. The roof would also deteriorate further exposing the church to more water damage,
- The grant is available now and is not guaranteed in the future, we could not do the repairs without the grant,
- The purpose of Reserves is to meet challenges such as this and whilst we do have some remaining this scheme will exhaust these. The alternative however would ultimately be the closure of an unsafe building, a position the PCC and the village is not willing to contemplate.

The PCC recognises totally that Church is not just about a building but we cannot escape the fact that having a building of such architectural and historical significance brings with it a great responsibility to do our best to preserve both the building and village heritage. Whether you have a great faith or non the Church stands at the centre of our village and aims to welcome all through its doors whether in celebration, reflection or remembrance, in search of peace or comfort at times of distress or in learning about our village and its history.

A condition of the HLF grant is to establish a Heritage resource within the Church and this will provide a focal point for village history and one of the outcomes of the scheme will be the more frequent opening of the Church outside normal Sunday services.

We could not do this without the support of the Heritage Lottery Fund and we are also seeking grants from other sources where they can be identified.

We could not however do it without the help of you, the local community and we are extremely grateful for the support that you have given to get us to this stage and, at the most critical time, to help fund the temporary repairs.



NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

3D SEISMIC SURVEY

The Parish Council has been given advance notification by Aurora Energy Resources (holder of PEDL 164) that they hope to acquire a 3D seismic survey this summer which includes parts of Halsall. They have advised Sefton MBC that they expect to commence the survey on 28th May. A Freedom of Information request to the DECC revealed that 4 Landowners refused permission for access to their land, but the Secretary of State gave leave for Aurora to apply to the High Court to obtain such access. On legal advice, as a result of facing huge legal costs, the Church Commissioners, who are one of two major Landowners, commenced negotiations with Aurora to impose conditions on access.

Ecological Survey and Habitat Assessments undertaken by Tesla, Aurora's contractors for the survey, indicate that the survey can only be undertaken between 15th April and 15th August. Aurora/Tesla have stated that they will be engaging with the community by carrying out a leaflet drop in the affected areas. The revised survey map is copied below and the new area is that which extends further into Halsall and Formby but excludes Aughton Park.



Aurora have stated:

"Should the results of the survey prove to be encouraging, it is likely that we will subsequently seek planning permission to drill a number of exploratory wells."

At the Parish Council meeting on 11th May 2016 it was Resolved that that the Council support and work with HAF in the fight against fracking and therefore please can anyone who receives a leaflet let the Parish Clerk or HAF know (HAF Tel: 01704 841900 Email: <u>haf@fastmail.com</u>).

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR BOROUGH COUNCILLOR

I would like to thank the residents of Halsall for putting their faith in me to represent them at West Lancashire Borough Council. I recognise that, although I was elected, not everyone voted for me and I will work hard to justify this position of trust.

I said at the Parish Council meeting on 11th May: "What a time to become Borough Councillor?". However, that is why I put myself forward for election. We are facing many serious issues in Halsall including a threatened seismic survey, the effects of withdrawal of government funding to our Borough and County Councils and the Environment Agency, resulting in difficult budget decisions and the decision by the EA to turn off 5 flood pumps in the area.

When I was out and about in the run-up to the election, residents highlighted many ongoing issues; the flooding at Christmas, withdrawal of the bus service in Shirdley Hill, the sheer volume of traffic, speeding, lack of Police visibility in the village, the poor state of some of our roads and lanes, ineffective new street lighting in certain areas of the village, inconsiderate parking on pavements, housing issues, building on the greenbelt, lack of activities for young people and more. I will be working closely with the Parish Council and adding my voice to theirs and assisting their hard work in taking up issues with the relevant bodies WLBC, LCC and the Police.

We face some tough challenges ahead but I promise all the residents of Halsall that I will listen to and communicate with them and work with all my enthusiasm to represent the village. My "surgery" will be held before the Parish Council meetings each month at 6.30 pm and I welcome everyone to come along to express their concerns or just to have a chat.

It is much appreciated by myself, governors and parents. We are very fortunate to have so many committed staff who volunteer to support the school with these wonderful opportunities.

School Outings

The teachers have again planned some superb educational trips for the children.

In recent months there have been outings to :

- Delamere Forest
- Lancaster Castle
- St Anne's RC Church

All these trips have been generously funded through the school's PTFA. A big thanks to the PTFA.

Sporting Success

In recent months, children from Halsall St Cuthbert's have performed brilliantly at a range of West Lancashire Primary Schools sporting events.

- The boys' football team won the small schools 7-a-side league, losing only 1 of its 12 matches.
- The Bench ball team won gold at the district tournament.

- The year 3/4 and 5/6 teams won gold at the athletics championships.
- Our gymnasts gained no fewer than 15 gold medals at the local schools' gymnastics competition.
- Both our Girls' year 3+4 team and our Boys' Year 3+4 team, won team gold medals at the small schools' Cross Country Championships in Tarleton.

Field Fencing

We are hoping to replace the fencing around the school field and make it more tidy, attractive and secure. Mackay and Simpson Fencing will be carrying out the work in the next few weeks.

Academisation

The government has now back-tracked from its "Forced Academisation" initiative and this is very much welcomed. Common sense has prevailed. Phew! The National Teaching Unions, now hope that government will turn its attention some of the main issues affecting many of our primary schools today, in particular :

- A lack of funding to maintain staffing and resources
- A shortage of teachers and school places to cope with rising demand
- The overcomplicated, restrictive and uninspiring National Curriculum which makes learning much less fun and stifles children's creativity.
- The excessive, administrative workload
- An unfair, data-driven assessment system that is out-of-touch with reality
- The low-level classroom disruption
- Cyber-bullying and physical and verbal assaults on members of staff
- Dilapidated buildings in need of urgent modernisation
- Low staff morale

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June & July at-a-glance

June is the month when the weather improves in leaps and bounds and so does the garden. Summer flowers make their first appearance; roses are in full bloom and powerful with scent. There's still lots to keep on top off in June – but don't forget to leave time to sit and enjoy the view.

Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Water & deadhead plats regularly.

Remove perennial weeds.

Propagate roses & shrubs by taking softwood cuttings

Keep on top off training climbing & rambling roses & tie in clematis.

Layer clematis.

Prune Clematis Montana if necessary.

Continue to clip privet & other fast growing hedges.

Dig up tulip & hyacinth bulbs when foliage dies off & store dry bulbs in a cool dry, dark dry place ready to replant in autumn.

Plant out summer bedding plants.

Sow winter & early spring plants in trays under glass.

Water & feed containers & hanging baskets regularly.

Continue planting green-house grown frost-tender vegetables outside.

Transplant leek & brassica seedlings.

Keep all fruit trees well watered in dry weather.

Thin heavy crops of plums, apples, & pears.

Prune fan-trained apple or pear trees if necessary.

Harvest rhubarb & strawberries.

Continue to pot up rooted cuttings.

Take cuttings from fuchsias & pelargoniums.

Continue pollinating melons & remove male flowers from cucumbers.

Introduce new fish.

Watch out for

Lily beetle.

Blackspot, powdery mildew & rust on roses.

Blackfly on broad beans.

Moles.

Plants in their Prime

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
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
