The Rector Writes

One of my favourite Services in the life of our United Benefice is the Confirmation Service. It is a day of great celebration when the church is quite literally packed to the rafters as family and friends come together to support the young people and adults who are taking this next important step on their Christian journey. It was during one of these Confirmation Services a couple of years ago that the Bishop gave a particularly memorable sermon - well to me anyway!

In his sermon, which he said was for the children, but the adults could listen to too, the Bishop talked about Confirmation as being the time when we make a promise to follow Jesus, and He makes a promise to be with us always.

In making a promise to follow Jesus, the Bishop reminded all of us of four ways in which each of us could do this:-


- To read a little bit from one of the Gospel stories each day. By reading more about Jesus we can get to understand more about how he wants us to live our lives.
- To take our Communion regularly. It is through the Eucharist that Jesus comes very close to us and gives us the strength to live our lives.
- To make time each day to say our prayers. It is through prayer that we speak and listen to God, and He speaks and listens to us.
- To do something good each day and to help someone who is in need. Being a Christian means being an example to others, just like Jesus was an example, always being prepared to help people in need.

As we continue on our Lenten journey of preparation these four points made by the Bishop, should give each of us food for thought on how we live our lives as Christians in Halsall, Lydiate and Downholland.

May this Lent be a time of renewal and growth for each of us as we continue on your Christian journey.

NOW IN HALSALL

Memories

The memories of Halsall resident Mr Harry Howard age 96. Told in his own words.

My childhood home was 88 Carr Moss Lane. The house was barely twenty years old when we moved in, but at that time had no electricity and only a dry 'petty' at the bottom of the small backyard.

Paraffin lamps and similar fuel for cooking on a Valour stove and oven were superseded some years later by electricity, along with electric street lights. Even then my mother was loathe to change her cooking methods and I recall breakfasts cooked on the Valour for most of my schooldays.

The coal fireplace in the middle room had a bread oven and hob upon which food pans could be boiled, and the back boiler provided hot water for domestic use until an immersion heater was installed in the bathroom.

The water system was eventually also improved with a WC in the bathroom and a flush system in the outside loo. Comfort indeed, but loss of income to Jim Billing who was a farm labourer at Parkhouse Farm nearby . He supplemented his wages by emptying dry toilets before they overflowed. They could be emptied from the rear, and his practice, when called in, was to dig a sufficiently deep trench in the kitchen garden. The quality of crops grown by this system was exceptional!

The ground floor in the house contained a larder off the kitchen, and a wash-house which included a coal heated boiler. Outside, too was a coalhouse and wood store to complete the amenities. We always kept hens and the kitchen garden included a few fruit trees and bushes. Mains drainage eventually replaced the original septic tank, which also had to be emptied at times, and a garage for the lorry was built by the backyard wall, with a back door into the yard as well as double doors at the front.

As youngsters we had pets. My sister Margaret favoured rabbits, but I was more interested in the small loft or dovecote where my father had half a dozen fantail pigeons. I think that at Hill House farm he had been a racing pigeon fancier - a sport very strong in South West Lancashire early last century, but not so prevalent nowadays.

Despite what would be considered a harsh existence today, I have mainly happy memories of my young days. My parents made sure, often to their own detriment, that my sister and I were always able to participate in village events and outings. The pantry shelves, (no refrigerators then!) were never bare. My father's occupation helped as he was able to bring imported fruit and other foodstuffs home from market, and it was order of the day to have a cooked breakfast, mid-day dinner and high tea. During holidays we were free to join our friends and disappear for the day without any concern from our mother.

When you see today's cost and choice of Christmas and birthday presents, the comparison with those I enjoyed is stark, but perhaps not so upon recollection. Meccano, Hornby trains and forts with lead soldiers, no matter how small the gift, would thrill any young boy, and the same applied to girls with dolls and perambulators. In addition there was a season for different games. Local soccer and cricket clubs have changed little in concept and I suppose netball and playground skipping have followed the tradition of their grandparents. But today, how often would you see a boy or a girl spinning a top, bowling a hoop or playing at marbles in the street or on waste ground, both common enough in 1930. There was little or no village traffic on the roads and much of that was horse-drawn. Tar macadam roads were ideal for these games.

Tops spun well and could be whipped along at a cracking pace. Iron bowling hoops were made by the blacksmith, often with a diameter equal to the height of its owner, who controlled his charge with an iron rod hooked at one end to fit the rim of the hoop. I never fully understood the game of marbles, or 'ollies' as I knew it. There were odd terms such as flicks, fudges and backstops. I always seemed to finish a game with a pocket full of plain white or green ollies having lost all those lovely coloured ones which had taken every halfpenny of my spending money, and there would be no cash left for the cup of ice cream from Fattorini's cart when it came round the village every summer Sunday afternoon.

Gardener's Corner

March at-a-glance

Remember the old rhyme about March winds & April showers? – Adding, a sharp frost can still catch you out but, the sun often shines this month and when it does you can almost see the new gardening season gathering steam daily. Happy Gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Spring clean the garden – fork over the soil in borders, weed & mulch, & dig up & divide overcrowded perennials.

Remove weeds & moss on paths & drives.

Deal with worm casts & molehills.

Make the first lawn cut if dry enough.

Redefine lawn edges.

Lay turf before the end of the month if not done in autumn.

Plant pot-grown shrubs, roses & climbers.

Prune modern bush roses, vigorous climbing roses, dogwoods & willows.

Tidy up patio roses, ground cover roses & shrub roses.

Moves deciduous trees & shrubs & plant new bare-root plants.

Renovate overgrown climbers.

Tidy up rock garden, alpine screes & sink gardens.

Sow wildflowers & hardy annuals.

Divide snowdrops 'in the green'.

Scrub or pressure-wash patio slabs.

Prepare soil, then sow lettuce, rocket, radishes, spring onions, leeks, broad beans & peas.

Plant onion sets & shallots.

Plant early potatoes grown in pots undercover; plant outdoors at the end of the month.

Sow hardy herbs & plant & divide perennial herbs.

Plant rhubarb, pot-grown fruit trees & bushes & strawberry plants.

Prune standard apple & pear trees before the buds burst into growth.

Hand-pollinate peaches, nectarines & apricots & protect early blossom with fleece.

Sow tomatoes, chillies, sweet-peppers, aubergines & half-hardy annuals under glass.

Watch out for

Slugs, snails, woodlice & greenfly under glass.

Mice in sheds & greenhouses.

On cold nights cover vulnerable plants with fleece.

Daffodils. Crocus. Lily-of-the-valley. Tulips. Magnolia stellata. Chaenomeles.

Forsythia. Camellias. Amelancheir Lamarckii. Aubrietia. Primula. Wallflowers.
