

#### HOLY WEEK AT ST CUTHBERT'S AND ST THOMAS'

**Holy Week** is, or should be, the most important week in the year for any Christian. It is a time when we think about the journey that Jesus made for us. A journey that would change the course of history for ever.

On **Palm Sunday** we remember that people welcomed Jesus: they shouted Hosanna! To the Son of David; and waved palm branches in welcome. The people were glad to meet him, and that is how it should be for us as Christians today – we should be glad to meet Jesus in our worship. We should be glad to know the person who loves us so very much. Our life should be one of gladness in meeting Jesus.

On **Maundy Thursday** we remember that Jesus had a meal with his friends, and through that meal, he told us that whenever we eat bread together and drink wine, he will be with us in a very special way. It is also the day that Jesus shows us what it is to be a servant to other people. That it doesn't matter how important we think we are, as Christians, we should always be ready to help other people. Jesus was the greatest – the Son of God – and yet he washed his disciples feet, thus setting an example for us all.

On **Good Friday** we remember that because he loved us so much, Jesus was nailed to a cross. He was put to death by people who didn't like him and who didn't understand him. And we still nail Jesus to the cross today, we still put him to death. We do it every time we say or think something nasty and horrible about someone else. Because when we do this, we let God down, we let other people down and we let ourselves down, and it means that Jesus died for nothing. Yet Jesus loves us so very much that he was prepared to die for us, and therefore, we should do our best in keeping him alive by the things we do and say.

On **Easter Day** we remember that Jesus rose gloriously from the dead, and by rising from the dead he shows us that all he had ever said was true. The light that had come into the world could never be extinguished – and that light is Jesus. And when he told the women in the garden to go and tell other people about what happened, he was also telling us to do the same. All of us are called to tell the story of Jesus and we are called to tell it by what we say and do, and by how we live our lives.

So as you get ready for **Holy Week** (and you will find details of the services we have planned in this magazine) remember what Jesus has done for you – remember the journey that he made for you, and come along and share that journey with others. **Holy Week** is the most important week in the Christian Year. It is a time when we remember that the history of the world was changed forever, and it was done by someone who loves us and who desperately wants us to journey towards him.

#### HAVE A HAPPY AND HOLY EASTER

#### The Reader Writes:

I recently came across something on Twitter which I found both thought-provoking and uplifting. It was written by a paediatrician called Alastair McAlpine, working in South Africa. His field is Paediatric Palliative Care. This is where a condition has no cure, is terminal and the approach is to manage symptoms. He recently said in an interview, "As horrible as it is when a child dies, one of the best rewards is a dignified and pain-free death. If I can make their lives slightly less bad, it's worthwhile. That keeps me going."

Below is what he posted on Twitter:

For an assignment, I asked some of my terminal paediatric palliative care patients (aged between four and nine) what they had enjoyed in life, and what gave it meaning. Kids can be so wise, y'know. Here are some of the responses

First: NONE said they wished they'd watched more TV. NONE said they should've spent more time on Face Book. NONE said they enjoyed fighting with others. NONE enjoyed hospital

MANY mentioned their pets: 'I love Rufus, his funny bark makes me laugh.' 'I love when Ginny snuggles up to me at night and purrs'. 'I was happiest riding Jake on the beach.'

MANY mentioned their parents, often expressing worry or concern: 'Hope mum will be ok. She seems sad.' 'Dad mustn't worry. He'll see me again soon.' 'God will take care of my mum and dad when I'm gone'.

#### ALL of them loved ice-cream.

ALL of them loved books or being told stories, especially by their parents: 'Harry Potter made me feel brave.' 'I love stories in space!' 'I want to be a great detective like Sherlock Holmes when I'm better!'

#### Folks, read to your kids! They love it.

MANY wished they had spent less time worrying about what others thought of them, and valued people who just treated them 'normally'. 'My real friends didn't care when my hair fell out.' 'Jane came to visit after the surgery and didn't even notice the scar!'

Many of them loved swimming, and the beach. 'I made big sandcastles!' 'Being in the sea with the waves was so exciting! My eyes didn't even hurt!' Almost ALL of them valued kindness above most other virtues: 'My granny is so kind to me. She always makes me smile.' 'Jonny gave me half his sandwich when I didn't eat mine. That was nice.' 'I like it when that kind nurse is here. She's gentle. And it hurts less'

Almost ALL of them loved people who made them laugh: 'That magician is so silly! His pants fell down and I couldn't stop laughing!' 'My daddy pulls funny faces which I just love!' 'The boy in the next bed farted! Hahaha!' Laughter relieves pain.

Kids love their toys, and their superheroes. 'My Princess Sophia doll is my favourite!' 'I love Batman!' (All the boys love Batman) 'I like cuddling my teddy'. Finally, they ALL valued time with their family. Nothing was more important. 'Mum and dad are the best!' 'My sister always hugs me tight' 'No one loves me like mummy loves me!'

Take home message: Be kind. Read more books. Spend time with your family. Crack jokes. Go to the beach. Hug your dog. Tell that special person you love them. These are the things these kids wished they could've done more. The rest is details. Oh... and eat ice-cream.

Food for thought.

#### A message from Glen, my journey

Many of you will have heard by now that after a lifetimes' journey to this point I have been accepted for training to become a priest. It's very difficult to explain how I feel right now but the words happy, excited, humbled and daunted come to mind. Paul suggested I explain my journey so far, so where to start? Well at the beginning I suppose. As a child in Sunday School I always felt that one day I should probably become a missionary or something a feeling that stayed with me even throughout my teens, prompting me at about sixteen to approach my then vicar. In those days women in the priesthood were only a distant dream and so I trained as a Sunday school teacher until I married moved away and had my own children.

Eventually I moved to Lydiate and was encouraged by my friend Carol Kavanagh, who was Sunday School Superintendent at St Thomas Lydiate at the time, to join Sunday school as a teacher. I loved teaching at Sunday school and eventually became Sunday school leader for many years. I really enjoyed Sunday school and being involved and part of St Thomas Church. Eventually however I felt that God was asking me to do more, a nagging feeling (yes God does nag!) that became stronger until I decided to explore the possibility of becoming a Reader. I discussed it with Paul who while being delighted that I felt I had a calling, I have to tell you felt that I really needed to consider ordained ministry. I prayed a lot about this, but felt at this time becoming a Reader was the path I should take.

I applied for training and was accepted, and I have loved being a Reader, however shortly after I became licensed I started to feel uncomfortable and the nagging feeling came back, and so I decided to investigate the possibility of applying for ordination training. The system then was very different to now and all I can say is I was told at that time that I was too old. I decided that all I could do was to carry on with my Reader ministry and do my best to serve God. To my surprise and concern the feeling that God was asking more of me continued.

One of the delights of our benefice is that we are often asked to take ordinands on placement some of who would question why I had not gone forward for ordination myself and I would explain that I was too old; that is until the last ordinand we had, Keith, who challenged that assumption and told me I wasn't as he had someone on his course the same age as me. I prayed very hard and long and after discussion with Paul and with his full support I phoned the Vocations Officer at St James House and went to see her, the first thing she said to me when I sat down was "you are not too old"! From that moment on although the route to ordination is necessarily very thorough and challenging, my journey accelerated down the selection pathway, culminating with a trip to see Bishop Richard who decided he was happy to refer me to BAP (Bishops Advisory Panel).

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> January I went for three days to Ely in Cambridge to BAP and on 1<sup>st</sup> February I received THE phone call to say that I had been recommended for ordination training. It's still sinking in and I am very slowly coming down to earth. I know it is going to be a tremendous challenge but it's one I'm looking forward to. Throughout this journey I have taken just one step as a time, unsure where the journey might lead, but trusting in God and his plan for my life. God is a God of surprises and so I step forward again in trust and although from September I may not be around quite as much as usual due to training, I'm not leaving the parish as the plan is God willing that in two years time I will licensed as Assistant Priest to our Benefice.

I am so grateful for the prayers and support I have received, and ask you please to keep me in your thoughts and prayers as I begin my training in September.





#### Gardener's Corner

#### March at-a-glance

Remember the old rhyme about March winds & April showers? – Adding, a sharp frost can still catch you out but, the sun often shines this month and when it does you can almost see the new gardening season gathering steam daily. Happy Gardening.

#### **General Garden Tasks**

Spring clean the garden – fork over the soil in borders, weed & mulch, & dig up & divide overcrowded perennials.

Remove weeds & moss on paths & drives.

Deal with worm casts & molehills.

Make the first lawn cut if dry enough.

Redefine lawn edges.

Lay turf before the end of the month if not done in autumn.

Plant pot-grown shrubs, roses & climbers.

Prune modern bush roses, vigorous climbing roses, dogwoods & willows.

Tidy up patio roses, ground cover roses & shrub roses.

Moves deciduous trees & shrubs & plant new bare-root plants.

Renovate overgrown climbers.

Tidy up rock garden, alpine screes & sink gardens.

Sow wildflowers & hardy annuals.

Divide snowdrops 'in the green'.

Scrub or pressure-wash patio slabs.

Prepare soil, then sow lettuce, rocket, radishes, spring onions, leeks, broad beans & peas.

Plant onion sets & shallots.

Plant early potatoes grown in pots undercover; plant outdoors at the end of the month.

Sow hardy herbs & plant & divide perennial herbs.

Plant rhubarb, pot-grown fruit trees & bushes & strawberry plants.

Prune standard apple & pear trees before the buds burst into growth.

Hand-pollinate peaches, nectarines & apricots & protect early blossom with fleece.

Sow tomatoes, chillies, sweet-peppers, aubergines & half-hardy annuals under glass.

#### Watch out for

Slugs, snails, woodlice & greenfly under glass.

Mice in sheds & greenhouses.

On cold nights cover vulnerable plants with fleece.

#### Plants in their Prime

Daffodils. Crocus. Lily-of-the-valley. Tulips. Magnolia stellata. Chaenomeles. Forsythia. Camellias. Amelancheir lamarckii. Aubrietia. Primula. Wallflowers. Cornus. Azara. Spiarea. Skimmia japonica. Viburnum tinus. Jasmine. Scilla. Garrya. Clematis `Freckles`. Malus. Scilla
