Public appeal to fund the repairs to the Church Spire.

St Cuthberts Church is a Grade1 listed building dating back to the 14th Century, although records suggest that a church building was probably on this site from the 12th Century onwards. Grade 1 listed buildings are buildings of exceptional interest, sometimes considered to be of international importance and only 2.5% of listed buildings are Grade 1.

This beautiful building at the heart of our village is special. Yes, its listed status reflects its historical and architectural importance but to those of us who live, and have lived, in this village it is much more than that and we have a responsibility to look after it for future generations.

Those who visit the church and churchyard will notice that we have spent time and money over this last few years improving the grounds and keeping the church in good order. This has been achieved through the wonderful efforts of volunteers and restricted donations.

Unfortunately over this last year we discovered a significant problem with the church spire and due to the dangers that this presented the Parochial Church Council (PCC) organised temporary repairs. We now need to put in place the long term solution which requires bringing part of the spire down to enable the installation of a new tie rod and re-building at a cost that is likely to be in excess of £15,000.

The Church's annual running costs are in excess of £50,000 and the income that comes from the local community underpins those costs. We could not remain open without this support. Over the last three years we have had to use dwindling reserves to prop up these running costs and know that we are likely to have to continue to do so. It is for this reason that the PCC have agreed to launch an appeal to raise the funds needed to carry out the repairs.

The PCC has already begun some fundraising events for next year and all ideas or contributions for creative ways of raising some funds will be welcomed!

We hope to install an appeal thermometer in the churchyard so that we can all see how the appeal is progressing.

Please also watch this space for news and please do consider what you may be able to give, whether it is time or money, to support the appeal.

Admissions September 2014

We have 42+ Residents in Shirdley Hill trained in the use of the Defibrillator thanks to Cheryl Picstock from North West Ambulance Service who gave a very interesting training session at St Aidan Hall. The installation work should be completed and the unit commissioned on the Shirdley Hill site by the time this magazine has been delivered.

It has been a great fundraising effort with donations from Residents, Parish Council and Residents Association.

DEFIBRILLATOR REMINDER

- D- Check for danger/ risks-protect yourself.
- R- Check **response** shake and shout at the casualty looking for signs of consciousness
- S- Shout for help and call 999 explaining your location and what's happened
- A- Open the airway by tipping the head back to remove tongue from airway
- **B-** Check **breathing** by looking for regular chest rise and fall, feeling for breath and hearing for abnormal noisy breathing. For 10 secs.

If breathing place in recovery position

If not breathing/ not breathing normally:

- C- Start chest **compressions** to a rate of staying alive/ 100 compression a min and pumping hard and fast on the centre of the chest over the sternum/ breast bone. Keep elbows unbent and arms straight kneeling closely to the casualty.
- **D** Get access to **defibrillator** by dialling 999 and giving the call taker your location and explaining the casualty condition.

Our Reader Mr David Walker Writes:

National Memorial Arboretum - The past is the key to the future

The National Memorial Arboretum is the UK's year-round centre of Remembrance. It is situated in Staffordshire and opened its doors to the public in May 2001. It is a spiritually uplifting place which honours the fallen and recognises both their service and sacrifice.

Sited in the heart of the Nation, with 50,000 maturing trees and over 200 memorials, it is a beautiful and lasting tribute to those who serve their country or who have died in conflict.

The Arboretum was developed on land reclaimed after quarrying and stands close to the new national forest. This reclamation and new life constitutes a remarkably symbolic foundation for a place where remembrance and new understandings complement one another. The memorial Shot at Dawn, located so it is the first place to be touched by the dawn light, commemorates 300 soldiers shot for desertion or cowardice. Many were under the legal age for serving and others were sick with shell shock. In 2006 a mass pardon of those executed in this way was given, and the memorial embodies the regrets of a nation while celebrating the development of new understanding.

In the chapel is a wood carving of children gathered around a storyteller, just like the children in the bible who gathered around Jesus. Various adults listen in. On the front, are engraved the words, 'The past is the key to the future.'

At this time of year when we remember those who died in conflict let us thank God for their courage and sacrifice and commit ourselves to working towards justice and peace for all.

As one family, we reflect on the horrors of the past that continue to haunt humanity and darken our world.

Where pain still overwhelms, bring healing.

Where hearts are still breaking, bring comfort.

Where peoples are still oppressed, bring liberation.

Where communities are still victimised, bring justice.

Where children are still brutalised, bring compassion.

Where lives are still crushed, bring hope.

Where evil is perpetrated, bring repentance.

Where war still devastates, bring peace.

But most of all,

wherever a single voice cries out in the darkness,

bring us to one another,

in the name of the love you bear in your heart for all people, all nations and all creation

Amen.


