Edward Culshaw

Kings Liverpool Regiment 12th Battalion 19350

Killed in action on the 4th September 1916, that bloodiest of years, that had seen the massacre at the Somme.

I am very grateful to Mrs Susan Roberts for the privilege of permitting me to see Edward Culshaw's war records and the war diaries pertaining to the advance towards Guillemont, which was part of the offensive known as the Battle of the Somme. Edward Culshaw was her great uncle and a brave soldier. I had never read any war diaries before and they certainly had an impact on me because the day to day horror of the battlefield is revealed. Not least the apprehension and frightening uncertainty. They describe in detail the movements of troops forwards and back, facing heavy bombardment in a landscape of craters and bunkers. Tactics day by day are revealed, some successful, some catastrophic and within them the death of this young soldier killed by a shell that also killed another Halsall lad, Lance Corporal Robert Gibbons.

Edward, a signalman at Fazakerley Station also worked at Plex Moss Station. He was unmarried and both his parents James Culshaw and Ann née Cave of Plex Lane were deceased. His next of kin was his elder brother John.

He had enlisted without question in Southport on the 7th September 1914 and was told that his service would last 3 years but he would be retained if the war went any longer. He agreed selflessly to all this, even that he might be kept to help out in a military hospital should the war end, until his service was no longer required. All this he did for King George Vth and country, signed and attested by his own signature. He was of average height 1 metre 67 cm (5'6") weighing 63 kilos (10 stone).

He began his training in Aldershot and it was not long before a spell on Salisbury plain had equipped him for transfer to France. Assigned to the 12th Battalion of the King's Liverpool Regiment, he arrived at the end of July 1915 travelling to Armentières on the 2nd of August. The 12th were a troop of 30 officers and nearly 1000 in the ranks and they were soon involved in a subsidiary operation at the Battle of Loos. This took place from the 5th to the 12th September and casualties were light. The second tour from the 25th September demonstrated that the men were not quite practised in moving safely around trenches and many were picked off by German snipers, they also came under heavy shelling. From October to the end of the year they were billeted at Laventie and saw relatively little action while holding the trenches.

On March the 12th the next year they were moved close to the fierce fighting at Ypres and they held their position until April before being relieved. They learnt a major attack on Guillemont would take place at the end of Summer.

Guillemont was a thorn in the side of the British command. It had cost many British lives and seemed impossible to take. Midday on September the 3rd was zero hour for the battalions assembled for the push and that included Edward Culshaw and the 12th King's Liverpool Regiment

All throughout the previous day they shelled enemy lines in Guillemont. In the town hardly a stone upon stone was left standing. August that year 1916 had been hot with temperatures generally in the high 70's Fahrenheit (25 degrees Celsius). Dawn broke on the 4th September and was accompanied by wind and showers the temperature fell by several degrees and rain threatened. This was a welcome relief for soldiers transporting heavy equipment in full battle gear, but the rain of German machine gun fire was ever present. The 5th Division prepared to attack the German second position from Point 48 to Wedge Wood and Valley Trench to the north. Two battalions from the 16th (Irish) Division were attached to the 5th Division and one to the 20th Division. The 12th King's division were brought up to support the Irish Leinsters, they were heavily attacked by artillery fire on the left flank where the bombers (soldiers trained in launching grenades) suffered many casualties, one of whom was Edward Culshaw. The offensive led to the British and Irish forces taking Guillemont where they exposed a labyrinth of fortified underground trenches revealing the extent of the German's resistance.

Edward is buried where he fell and his name is recorded on the great monument at Thiepval in Northern France. He was awarded the World War 1 Service Medal, the 1914-15 Star Medal and the Victory medal posthumously. Edward's brother John Culshaw received the medals on Edward's behalf. The whereabouts of these medals are uncertain but it is hoped that they are held by another branch of the family.

Seven of his brothers and sisters mourned his passing including Alice with whom he lived and Catherine who was Susan's great grandmother.

On the 100th anniversary of Edward's death Susan, with three other family members visited Thiepval, Guillemont and Ypres to honour his memory and sacrifice.





Gardener's Corner

November at-a-glance

Once the autumn leaves have fallen, evergreen shrubs really come into their own. They give the garden year-round backbone and some are very striking, in shades of gold, reds, bronze or blues, as well as plain green or various variegated patterns, late berries, craggy tree trunks and coloured stems of trees and shrubs – who said winter was dull. Happy gardening.

General garden tasks

Carry out winter digging of forking over.

Check over the garden for anything that's likely to be at risk from frost Continue cutting the grass if conditions allow, but raise the blades..

Collect up dead leaves from the lawn & make leaf mould & potting compost Lay turf if you didn't last month


Plant & move bare-root trees & shrubs

Stake well any newly planted trees

Sow seeds of hardy shrubs & trees

Plant tulips this month

Dig up dahlia tubers once the plants start to die off after the first frosts



Plant fruit trees

Ventilate the greenhouse on warm days but reduce watering

Check stored fruit & vegetables

Grow windowsill & salad herbs

Do your autumn pond clear-out if you didn't get round to it last month Clean pool filters & check cables for pumps & lights

Watch out for

Snails in crevices around the garden

Mice in sheds & greenhouses especially where there is stored fruit

Pigeons pinching your winter greens

Squirrels digging up your bulbs

Windy weather disturbing tree stakes chaffing the bark.

Get ahead

Think about any garden designing & alterations you'd like to do over the winter months

Give the lawn mower a maintenance check now or over the winter

Start winter pruning

Mulch fruit trees

Plants in their prime

Viburnum. Ornamental cabbages. Winter flowering pansies. Potted topiary. Gaultheria. Skimmia. Clematis `freckles`. Mahonia. Euonymus. Pyracantha. Winter iasmine.
