The Rector Writes:-

'He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray'. (Luke 11)

Time and time again we read in the Gospel's that Jesus prayed. Sometimes he took himself off to be on his own to pray and at other times he prayed with his disciples or with the people he was with at the time. Why? What is prayer? Why did Jesus feel the need to pray?

Well put very simply prayer is talking to and with God. Just as our friend-ships with our family and friends grow stronger the more we talk and spend time with them, so does our relationship with God. There is no magical formula, no right way, or right time to do it. Prayer is having a conversation with God about anything, everything, anytime, and anywhere.

Some people like to get up early in the morning to pray, while others prefer night time. People enjoy talking to God while they take a walk, and others like to sit and meditate quietly reflecting on what God does in their lives. Many read Bible passages and turn them into prayers. When needs arise in the middle of our busy days, we can all whisper a short prayer and God will hear.

It is not of course all plain sailing and it would be true to say that some of us, if not all of us find prayer difficult at times. We seem to get a mental block, we can get disheartened, make excuses about life being too busy, and make up all kinds of excuses not to pray. But we should never give up we should keep persevering, because God never gives up on us. We are His children and he wants to hear from us and of that there is no doubt. We can, through prayer, take all our life to God. The good things we want to thank him for. The not so good things that we need help with. God will listen, and he will show us the way because he loves us so very much.

So please try and find some time each and everyday to spend with God. Talk to Him, listen to His still small voice, and if you've not spoken to him for a while renew your relationship with Him. He really does want to hear from you.

World War One, The Dilemma for Farmers Sons

If you study the war memorial outside Halsall Church and look at the fallen from the Great War 1914-18 you will see few casualties in the years 1914 and 1915. However, the Ormskirk press reported on 15th September 1915 that Halsall had 45 recruits enlisted for service and this was before conscription became compulsory. George Marshall had been the first Halsall man to go to war. There were no deaths at this time but there were some lucky escapes. On 18th April 1914 David Oswald had been shot by a

German sniper but the bullet passed through his cap without injury. Sadly, the brave lad was to die later on in the war. Robert Parkin, of Plex Lane had been wounded with the Kings Liverpool Regiment and was withdrawn to a London hospital in September 1915 at the same time that Private T W Jump had become a prisoner of war after being captured by the enemy. Tom Ashcroft was the son of a Haskayne farmer and had volunteered from the outset of the war with the Army Service Corps, by Christmas he had been promoted to staff sergeant.

In a drive for recruitment a great march, starting at Manchester Road in Southport on 19th November 1914 saw 500 men of the Army Service Corps marching through Halsall, Barton and Lydiate ending up at Gore Houses where they took refreshments and marched back. A Halsall Parish Council meeting in the same month called for subscriptions to assist relief of distress caused by the war. Despite Halsall's brave record, dissenting voices criticised the lack of farmer's sons putting themselves forward to the conflict when men were making such sacrifices on the front. One writer stopped short of using the words 'cowards' but did say 'there was an appalling slackness to enlist because of the bucolic attitude'. The Rector of nearby Aughton church nounced the part drink played in keeping men from making the sacrifices that those abroad had to make.

In 1916 everything changed. Following the battle of Loos September 1915 and the Somme July 1916 there was a tremendous increase in the number of deaths. The local roll of war dead began to lengthen. Corporal Richard Gibbons who was a teamster for J Pilkington of Watson House, Halsall and Private Edward Culshaw, a railway worker from Plex Lane were slain by the same shell. This and similar stories turned public opinion against able-bodied young men who were still at home. Letters to the local Ormskirk press, accused them of profiteering from the jobs left vacant by husbands and sons on the front. Another denounced 'laggards' who played football and even those who watched, declaring it 'a waste of time, while those men could be doing something more worthwhile'. Farmers were essential workers and there was a drive for more land to be cultivated because of the growing threat of starvation posed by German U boats destroying food convoys. However, the climate was uncomfortable for farmer's sons. They were usually strong, strapping lads, capable of hard work and with crucial knowledge of machinery and terrain. It was normal after a hard day's work for them to want to relax with a pint in the local pub without whispers in corners.

It was also a normal reaction for a parent to want to protect their sons and keep them away from the carnage in France, the details of which were becoming more graphic in the press and on news reels, despite the efforts of propagandists to play down the bloodshed.

Some farmer's sons had joined up straight away like Thomas Ashcroft of Haskayne and they were held up as examples. The drive for recruitment in 1916 led to conscription and tribunals were set up to consider the merits of individual cases of exemption. On December 6th 1916 at the West Lancs Rural Tribunal, Barton farmer, Thomas Rainford of Barton House made an application to keep his son, James, a teamster aged 23 and two other sons, Tom 21 and John 19. Thomas argued that he had 200 acres, 30 cattle and 7 working horses, he had had to plough over another 23 acres of meadowland because of the war office demand for food. Lt Col Hopgood made the case for recruitment but Thomas Rainford argued that he had no land girls this year to assist him. Mr Pimbley on the committee thought he ought to send one of his sons to do his bit because other farmers were in the same predicament. Others argued that land workers were being pulled back from France because of essential need. The committee ruled for Thomas Ashcroft and his three sons stayed at home influenced by the fact that the County War Executive Committee had previously granted an exemption, but they left Mr Rainford with no doubt that they felt he should send one of his sons.

Meanwhile, those who had avoided call up, under the Military Service Act 1916, were named and shamed in the Ormskirk press on 31st August 1916. Information on the non enlisters was sought and was to be reported to the recruitment officer at the Corn Exchange Ormskirk. One man from this area was Patrick Toolis of Bangors Green, he may well have been an Irish seasonal worker and would therefore have a case for exemption. Certainly, such cases discouraged Irish workers from travelling over to England and taking up their usual seasonal work on Lancashire farms, leaving farmers more desperate. The Irish, however, played their part in the war and the Halsall memorial contains the name of John Hyland from Knock County Mayo who gave his life. He had come over as a seasonal worker but found regular employment and stayed in Halsall whilst sending a good part of his money home to his family in Ireland.

A tribunal on April 20th 1916 saw James Bond of Ivy Farm, Barton pleading the case for his four sons, James 33, Thomas 32, Henry 23 and William 19. He had 48 acres, his two eldest were exempted but the two younger lads had to go. It soon became expected that when a farmer had more than two sons then the others should go to war. At the same tribunal James Crane 36 a roadman and market gardener from Barton, was exempted. The appeals increased in number in the middle of 1916, John Grimshaw of Gorsuch Hall gained temporary exemption for his son Job but by September he had to go.

It was a dilemma for farmers who had sons but also a dilemma for the War Office to balance the need for provisions at home against the need for able bodied men at the front. When conscription included married men and was extended to men up to 51 years of age, the pressure increased. The years 1917 and 1918 saw the majority of casualties in the Halsall area.

EXPLORATORY DRILLING/FRACKING FOR SHALE OIL AND/OR GAS IN HALSALL

UPDATE

The Parish Council has been advised by Tesla that the proposed seismic survey in PEDL 164 has been postponed until 2015. However Aurora Exploration (UK) Ltd. have applied to Lancashire County Council for an extension of planning permission (LCC/2014/0095) at Norris Farm, Downholland Moss Lane, Formby until May 2016, where exploratory drilling has already taken place in the green belt.

The present government is openly committed to fracking and, to assist it, they are proposing to change the law of trespass to allow the exploration companies to carry out horizontal drilling under your home without your permission. There is an official government consultation on the subject online at:

The governments' stance is that extraction of shale oil and gas will be up and running by the end of this year. They maintain that it is for the good of the country and that it will bring money to local neighbourhoods. David Cameron has said:

"Companies have agreed to pay £100,000 to every community situated near an exploratory well where they're looking to see if shale gas exists. If gas is then extracted, 1 per cent of the revenue – perhaps as much as £10 million – will go straight back to residents who live nearby. This is money that could be used for a variety of purposes – from reductions in council-tax bills to investment in neighbourhood schools. It's important that local people share in the wealth generated by fracking."

It should be noted that residents in New York State opposed fracking even though they were offered 12.5%. The reason for this was due to the low yield of oil from fracking (less than 100th of conventional wells) which meant very little benefits to the community to offset the risk of environmental/structural damage even though the US government had not withdrawn the rights to individual compensation.

Your Parish Council would like to collate residents' views before the seismic survey takes place next year and a very short survey is overleaf. 

Gardener's Corner

October at-a-glance

One big benefit of autumn is that it is the start of a brand new season with a all of its own. We have the rich tapestry of autumn colours and late flowers to look forward to - low orange colour of an Indian summer and refreshing evenings with a nip in the air. Happy gardening.

General garden tasks.

Tidy borders lightly, clear weeds & cut down flower stems

Compost all green rubbish

Make a new lawn by laying turf

Reduce mowing

Carry out autumn lawn care

Plant container grown trees & shrubs, climbers & roses

Plant bare-root plants at the end of the month, providing the ground is ready

Check tree ties in windy weather

Prune late flowering climbing roses & repeat –flowering old-fashioned roses Take hardwood cuttings of roses towards the end of the month

Pot up cuttings taken in the summer

Trim privet hedges

Remove fallen leaves from the crowns of plants to prevent rotting

Lift tender perennials & bulbs

Once the veg patch is cleared, carry out winter digging

Cut down asparagus foliage

Plant spring cabbage & over wintering onion sets

Plant garlic towards the end of the month or next month

Pot up herbs for winter use

Pick apples & pears for storing mid-month

Prepare for new fruit trees & plant if conditions allow

Have a good clear out of the greenhouse & prepare for the cold weather Reduce the amount of water given to greenhouse plants as the nights get colder Have a pond clear out: cut down any dead & decaying leaves.
