The reader writes...

I'm finding it hard to get the images of the refugees from Syria, Eritrea, Afghanistan and other war-torn countries in Budapest out of my head. And I almost wish that I hadn't looked at the photo of 3-year old Aylan, who drowned in Turkey along with his 5-year old brother and his mother. Some things, once experienced, can't be forgotten. Lost innocence can't be restored.

Have you ever had a piece of music going round your head? Whether you want it to or not? It's called an "earworm" - a catchy piece of music that continually repeats in a person's mind after the music is no longer playing. There is a whole science of the earworm - why certain songs are more likely to stick in your mind than others. It can be really annoying when "Bob the Builder" or "The Birdy Song" repeatedly goes through your mind - or is that just me?

You can actually exploit this to your benefit. In the same way that visual images like those of the refugees can affect our state of mind and be a catalyst for action, what we hear in our heads can affect our state of mind. If I regularly listen to destructive or depressing messages in music, it is likely to have an impact on me. On the other hand, I can choose music that is uplifting; that will help me maintain a healthy mindset. Words/hymns like "The Lord's my shepherd, I'll not want, he makes me down to lie, in pastures green he leadeth me the quiet waters by; or "Be still and know that I am God"; or "Brother, sister, let me serve you, let me be as Christ to you; pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant too"

Let's choose what we look at and listen to wisely to build ourselves up and create the right frame of mind.







Halsall St Cuthbert's Primary School

General

We have returned to school with 151 children on roll.

We have 5 classes, each with a full-time teacher and 10 teaching assistants who provide daily support throughout the school. These assistants are invaluable. The school budget remains very healthy and staff turnover is extremely small. Parent satisfaction measured by the summer term Parent Questionnaire, is very high. Our recent OFSTED report is still something that we are incredibly proud of and is something that the staff richly deserved.

Standards

Attainment at Halsall continues to be very high with last year's test results being particularly impressive.

Attainment at the end of reception was significantly above the national average Attainment in Year 1 Phonics was significantly above the national average Attainment at the end of Key Stage 1 was well above the national average in Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

Attainment at the end of Key Stage 2 was significantly above the national average in Reading, Writing, Mathematics

These results are a great credit to the staff at Halsall. Teachers and assistants work incredibly hard to ensure that each child achieves their full potential. They work wirelessly to provide so many amazing opportunities for the children to work, learn and play.

New Curriculum

We are continuing to establish the New Curriculum in school. Co-ordinators have been working very hard redrafting schemes of work, attending training, feeding back to staff and purchasing new materials and equipment. It's all looking very exciting.

We're planning lots of school visits to support our class topics and most of these are very generously funded by the PTFA.

In the spring and summer terms, we have PGL residential holidays for year 4, then year 5 and a holiday in Bridlington for the year 6.

Staffing

We welcome back Mrs Georgina Green after her maternity leave. She is now the proud mum of baby Bethany Grace.

Many thanks to Mrs Jackie Gosson who did such a wonderful job in her absence. My Jim Halligan our caretaker, is still absent through illness but we hope that he will be able to return in some capacity in a few months. We wish him well in his recovery.

Gardener's Corner

October at-a-glance

One big benefit of autumn is that it is the start of a brand new season with a pattern all of its own. We have the rich tapestry of autumn colours and late flowers to look forward to - low orange colour of an Indian summer and refreshing evenings with a nip in the air. Happy gardening.

General garden tasks.

Tidy borders lightly, clear weeds & cut down flower stems Compost all green rubbish

Make a new lawn by laying turf

Reduce mowing

Carry out autumn lawn care

Plant container grown trees & shrubs, climbers & roses

Plant bare-root plants at the end of the month, providing the ground is ready

Check tree ties in windy weather

Prune late flowering climbing roses & repeat –flowering old-fashioned roses

Take hardwood cuttings of roses towards the end of the month

Pot up cuttings taken in the summer

Trim privet hedges

Remove fallen leaves from the crowns of plants to prevent rotting

Lift tender perennials & bulbs

Once the veg patch is cleared, carry out winter digging

Cut down asparagus foliage

Plant spring cabbage & over wintering onion sets

Plant garlic towards the end of the month or next month

Pot up herbs for winter use

Pick apples & pears for storing mid-month

Prepare for new fruit trees & plant if conditions allow

Have a good clear out of the greenhouse & prepare for the cold weather

Reduce the amount of water given to greenhouse plants as the nights get colder

Have a pond clear out: cut down any dead & decaying leaves.

Watch out for

First frosts

Plants in their prime

Japanese maples. Acers. Euonymus.Prycanthea. Malus. Colchicum. Nerine. Amaryllis. Perovskia. Chanomeles. Viburnum. Clematis varieties. Asters. Chrysanthemums. Kniphofia. Lavatera. Liriope. Penstemon.
