Micah Liverpool

This year's Harvest Appeal in our United Benefice will be Micah, Liverpool.

We are asked to make donations of non-perishable food and toiletries from the list of essentials provided. A suitable container will be available in each church during the month of September until out Harvest Festivals in October.

If necessary, it will be emptied from time to time during this period. In addition, most of the fresh produce given for our Harvest Festivals will be donated to Micah's Food Pantries and Community Markets.



NEW COUNCILLOR

The Parish Council are pleased to announce that Barry Assheton was co-opted onto the council at the meeting held on 10th July 2019.

PLANNING

2019/0547/FUL - 30 New Cut Lane - Single storey extension at front, pitched roof to replace flat roof to existing single storey extension at rear and installation of new first floor windows at rear.

PARKING ALONG SUMMERWOOD LANE

Cars parking either side of Summerwood Lane at school times and when funerals and weddings are taking place at St Cuthbert's are causing an obstruction and prevent large vehicles, including the emergency services from passing through.

Please use the Memorial Hall car park whenever possible.

PARKING ON NEW STREET NEAR TO THE JUNCTION WITH CARR MOSS LANE

This is creating a dangerous situation for cars trying to turn out of Carr Moss Lane because their line of sight is obstructed and we would ask that people refrain from parking so close to the junction before a serious accident occurs.

PARKING ON CARR MOSS LANE NEAR TO THE JUNCTION WITH LINEKAR DRIVE

Once again the Parish Council would ask people to use some common sense when parking their cars. and not to park so close to the junction as to restrict residents of Linekar Drive from being able to see oncoming cars approaching from both directions when exiting the drive.

PARKING ALONG MOSS ROAD AND SEGARS LANE

Cars double parking and parking on pavements are causing problems along Segars Lane. Can residents please park in their driveways if possible and leave enough room when parking on pavements to allow prams and wheelchairs to get through.



Is Halsall church aligned East to West?

There is a wonderful article on the orientation of churches, from a 2007 issue of Archaeology magazine.

"Armed with a Silva compass fixed to a piece of wood with brass screws, Ian Hinton surveyed almost 1,750 churches in England and Wales over 10 years. He resolved an old belief – but uncovered a new mystery."

The conclusion is most medieval churches do face east in accordance with the edict of the Council of Rome

1215. The average 'error' is only 4 degrees, which is pretty good. There are some tendencies that are very interesting: mainly that a church is more likely to be aligned north of east if the church itself is situated in the west of the country.

A small discrepancy might occur between Magnetic and Geographical North-Pole. It is quite possible that all but the earliest extant churches were aligned and built with the help of a compass.

Following on from this study I applied the theory to St Cuthbert's. Halsall varies from true east by 12-15 degrees, this is unusual it means that the church is approximately an hour out of alignment. I have determined this by observation and measurement at midday according to the 'equation of time' which is when the Sun is on the meridian (The highest point it achieves in the sky daily). Also sidereal time at night by observing the stars and their nightly movement of four degrees of the celestial sphere.

So did the architect of this wonderful church make a mistake? Could judgement have been impaired by partaking of too much ale or wine? Probably not, he or she has managed to align the church almost exactly one hour out of alignment which is quite accurate for a coincidence. This would have had consequences for the villagers with the timing of midday.

This was when the workers in the fields prayed the Angelus and when lunch was taken and meant that the afternoons could have been very long. A scratch dial on the church southern wall was often the way locals would determine time to eat lunch or ring the noon day bell. This would have been an hour out from what we now call Greenwich Mean Time and what astronomers call Universe time. The magnetic variation mentioned above might account for a variation of 4 or 5 degrees but 12 is a huge error and this may be accounted for because of the nature of the sandstone foundation which determined where the church could be built. It could be that the accurate alignment was not possible to ensure the structure had safe foundations so it had to be built along the line of secure foundation and this did not permit an accurate alignment with East. Subsequent generations would have assumed an accurate alignment. Therefore unless an influential person with some mathematical or astronomical prowess was able to point to an adjustment, the locals would have lived with this error for almost 600 years before clocks were commonplace and time centralised

Gardener`s Corner

September at-a-glance

Not so long ago, September was the end of the season – time to put the garden to bed - but not anymore. Mild autumns allow us to continue growing plants that slot into the summer border to give you another month or two of colour & interest. Happy Gardening.

General Tasks

Keep watering, feeding & deadheading – it's time consuming but it does pay off! Cut back any perennial stems that have finished flowering –like Iris Sibirica- to tidy garden.

Get the compost going – clearing generates a huge amount of waste.

Repair broken lawn edges, bumps & hollows.

Make new lawns from seed but delay laying turf till October.

Plant or move evergreens so the roots can establish before the first frosts.

Clip hornbeam, beech, Leyland cypress & thuja hedges before the middle of the month.

Cut slow growing yew & box hedges now if you only want to do the job once each year.

Plant spring flowering bulbs.

Replace summer bedding as it comes to an end with plants for winter & spring interest.

Deadhead & protect dahlias- but allow them to blacken with the first frost before lifting.

Collect seed from perennials.

Walk round the garden & move any perennials or shrubs that need a different position. Watch out for early frosts & move any tender plants under cover.

Plant spring cabbage.

Cut down asparagus foliage once it has turned yellow or buff (it may occur next month) Pot up herbs such as chives, mint, basil, coriander & parsley.

Continue harvesting blackberries, early apple varieties – pears at the end of the month. Reduce the watering & feeding of all greenhouse plants.

Continue to feed fish until the weather breaks.

Give a final light thinning-out of oxygenating plants, but only if necessary.
