- Friday-12. The boys in Standard V can do their Arithmetic with the exception of Geo. Gaskell who is the most careless boy in the School.
- Monday-15. Heard the II Standard say Multiplication Tables. Wm. Houghton, Wm. Marshall and Tho. Threlfall, no better.
- Tuesday-16. Richard Edwards makes no improvement in his writing and spelling and very little in his reading.
- Wednesday-17. The II Standard finished the II Standard Book to day.
- Thursday-18. Heard the III & IV Standard read to day. Many of the boys who are in these Standards have been most irregular in their attendance, and these take from the general efficiency.
- Friday-19. The boys in III Standard had a transcribing lesson this afternoon. These lessons do more to improve their writing than writing on copy books does.
- Monday-22. 14 boys did a sum in the III Standard and 12 were right and 2 wrong. In Subtraction 16 right and 1 wrong. In Multiplication 9 right and 7 wrong.

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- Tuesday 23. Gave the V Standard the hardest words to write in columns. These words were picked from a portion of their Reading lessons. Most of the boys spelt all.
- Wednesday 24. There has been a Coursing meeting to day, and many of the boys have gone, with the consent of their parents, to see it.
- Thursday 25. Finished the Book ~~of~~ of Genesis this morning. III. IV. V. Standards can answer on the Book very fairly.
- Friday 26. The III. IV. Standards, ^{had} as an exercise, to write out what the Apostles Creed teaches, and all did it correctly.
- Monday 29. Commenced the Book of Exodus this morning with Stand^s III. IV. V. The II Standard failed to read their lesson this afternoon, and was put back.
- Tuesday 30. 97 boys in attendance to day. Examined the III. IV. Standards in dictation. 15 passed. Two boys fetched home owing to the death of their Father.
- Wednesday 31. 10 Boys late this morning. Most of them had been cautioned about being late and they were punished by writing out

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forty lines from the lesson books

Thursday. 1.

Wm. ~~Smith~~ ^{Young} and Wm. Roughly make no improvement in Arithmetic. They appear to have no idea of Number. particularly the ~~latter~~ former.

Friday. 2.

The II Standard transcribed from their lesson books to day.

Monday. 5.

The II Standth to day had Sums in Addition & Subtraction from Cards. The Sums were all different so that they could not copy. 13 boys were right.

Tuesday. 6.

The III & IV Stand^{ds} wrote out the last question and Answer in the Catechism. All were right.

Wednesday.

The III Standard commenced Compound Rules to day.

Thursday. 8.

The IV Stand^d brought their Sums in Division of Weights & Measures wrong. This is the result of Carelessness; they were kept from play to do them and they got them right.

Friday. 9.

The day wet which has caused many to stop at home.

- Monday. 12. Only a few boys to day in the 1st Class. The mild weather is beginning to draw them out to work in the fields.
- Tuesday. 13. Holiday. Shrove Tuesday.
- Wednesday. 14. Service twice in Church to day, which has interfered with the lessons.
- Thursday. 15. The III Standard had a transcribing lesson to day: ^{on paper} Many of the boys in this standard have improved much since they began to transcribe on paper, and they are now prepared for dictation on paper.
- Friday. 16. All the lessons of the week reviewed.
- Monday. 19. The II Standard commenced their Reading Book this morning. John Dalton, Wm Leadbetter, Wm Poughley, Wm Threlfall read it imperfectly.
- Tuesday. 20. Gave the IV & V Standards four sums each in their respective standards, and all were right.
- Wednesday. 21. The III Standard can write down figures as far as hundreds in thousands. James Benson, Peter Thomson, and Wm Threlfall are imperfect in it. The Arithmetic is good.

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- Thursday 22. Gave the 11th class the circumstances connected with the birth of John the Baptist.
- Friday 23. The whole School received the lessons which have been gone through during the week.
- Monday 26. The 4th class was questioned on the Book of Genesis, and most of them answered fairly.

- Tuesday 27. Examination of the School by H. M. Inspector. His report of the School was. "The School continues to do well and the examination has been very satisfactory"
- Wednesday 28. Holiday. Day of Humiliation on account of the cattle plague.
- Thursday 1. Every class commenced the Reading Book in which each will be examined next year.
- Friday 2. Few boys in attendance since Tuesday as it has been a broken week.
- Monday 5. The II Standard of last year read the III Standard reading Books very fairly. Better than I expected. This is owing to the manner in which they were taught last year.

- Tuesday 6. The I & III Standards had a lesson on the Birth of Our Lord. It was all carried away.
- Wednesday 7. Most of the Boys in Standard IV can do Compound Addition already. They are well up with addition & Multiplication Table so that their progress will now be rapid.
- Thursday 8. The IV. V. VI. Standards had a transcription lesson on their Exercise Books. I find this improves their writing a great deal more rapidly than writing on Copy Books.
- Friday 9. The Tables ^{W. & M.} not known by boys in the IV Standard. I advised them all to get books.
- Monday 12. Admitted 5 boys out of the girls' School. They are very deficient in writing.
- Tuesday 13. Heard the IV Standard read to day. Robert Hayes, James Bond, and Thomas not fit for it.
- Wednesday 14. As there are only 3 boys in Standard VI I put them to read with Standard V. It is not worth making a separate class for such a small number.
- Thursday 15. The II. III Standards had a lesson on Our Lord's going to keep the Passover with his mother at Jerusalem.

- Friday 16. The Church Catechism said and the IV. V. VI. Standards examined as far as the Sacraments.
- Monday 17. One of the Monitors ill to day. All the sixth Standard absent except one.
- Tuesday 20. Both Monitors absent to day through illness. All the Standards going on fairly.
- Wednesday 21. The School very much thinner to day. The fine weather is causing the boys, who are able, to work in the fields.
- Thursday 22. The IV Standard unable to say the Tables of Weights and was kept in at noon to learn them.
- Friday 23. All the ^{old} ~~class~~ ^{for the week} gone through. IV. V. VI. Standards had the Church Catechism with questions on it.
- Monday 26. The spelling of the IV & V Standards is very good.
- Tuesday 27. Gave the III. IV. V. VI. Standards the Sufferings of Jesus Christ, which are commemorated in Passion week.
- Wednesday 28. The III Standard has improved in their Multiplication sums.
- Thursday 29. Broke up to day for the Easter holidays
- Monday 4. ^{April} Commenced to day with only a few scholars. All the big boys working in the fields.

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- Tuesday. 10. The IV & V Standards had the visit of Sethre to Moses in the Wilderness. The boys answered.
- Wednesday. 11. The Sums taken home by the III Standard to be worked were most of them wrong, and others forgot their Sates.
- Thursday. 12. The II Standard can do compound Subtraction fairly. The Scripture lesson to II. IV. V. Standards on our Lord's resurrection.
- Friday. 13. The Reading lessons reviewed. Sum set in old Rules which the boys do pretty accurately.
- Monday. 16. Most of the boys in Standards III. IV. V. were unable to pay their collect and were kept in to learn it.
- Tuesday. 17. The II Standard commenced Compound Multiplication. Wm. Schreffelt and Robert Rimmer failed to get Square Measure.
- Wednesday. 18. Heard Standard I read to day. Peter Achers cannot read at all. The rest are progressing fairly.
- Thursday. 19. Heard Standard III read to day. John Dalton the worst reader, altho' he has had more practice than the others.

April, 1866.

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- Friday 20. The III Standard exercised in Notation as far as tens in Millions. The exercises done better than last Friday.
- Monday 23. Reviewed portion of the Book of Genesis. Found many, who knew it well three months, had forgotten it.
- Tuesday 24. II Standard long reading lessons to day to make up for lost time. Wm Brown & Robert Sopher not fit for this Standard.
- Wednesday 25. A lesson this morning to the upper Standards on the miraculous draught of fishes.
- Thursday 26. Tried Standard III in Multiplication by ² single figure. All were right, except roughly as usual.
- Friday 27. All the lessons for the week gone through, and the Church Catechism said. The lower classes in the old School, under monitor.
- Monday 30. Lesson on 'Our Lord and his disciples plucking the ears of corn on the Sabbath day'. Most of it carried.
- May
Tuesday 1. Gave the IV Standard a drilling in Compound multiplication. Several boys are slow in their mental calculations. They must be exercised more.
- Wednesday 2. Heard the III Standard spell. Most of the boys cannot do the exercise. This is the first spelling lesson they have had.

April 21st. 1866

Summary of H. M. Inspector's Report.

Boys. The School is well taught and the attainments do credit to the Master.

May. 3rd Blundell Manager

Thursday 3rd Went over a portion of the Book of Genesis with III. IV. V. Standards. Many answered well.

Friday. 4. The catechism gone through. The III Standard in the old School. A few imperfect in the text.

Monday. 7 The 23rd Chapter of Exodus read by Standards IV. V. and afterwards examined.

Tuesday. 8. The III Standard dictation, which was fairly done. J. Dalton the worst.

Wednesday. Read the II Standard read today. This Standard will require a good deal of attention to make it up to the mark for re-examination.

May. 1866.

- Thursday 10. Gave the II Standard a lesson in Arithmetic. Several of the boys can do simple addition correctly. Wm Brown not fit for the Standard.
- Friday 11. Gave III. IV. V. Standards a lesson on the Trinitarian covenant. The other Standards went through the text.
- Monday 14. 24th Chapter of Exodus read and boys questioned upon it.
- Tuesday 15. A Lesson on the Centurion's servant to Stand^d III. IV. V. Most of it learned.
- Wednesday 16. Stand^d IV. Commenced Compound Multiplication. Compound Addition, and Subtraction they can do, with the exception of Walter Cox, who is very backward.
- Thursday 17. Standard III imperfect in Arithmetic. This Standard will require a good deal of practice in this also.
- Friday 18. All reading lessons gone through, which have been read through the week. The Text of Church Catechism
- Monday 21. 25th Chapter of Exodus read and boys examined on it.
- Tuesday 22. Standard I read for me to day. All

May 1866.

- Wednesday 23. Can read the I Standard, Book fairly.
The boys in Standard I have to be divided into the parts. This is owing, to some of the boys attending irregularly, and others only just entered.
- Thursday 24. Examined the III Standard, in Rotation all could do it as far as Units in thousands.
- Friday 25. Exercised the IV & V Standards in difficult numbers are far hundreds in millions. many are sharp at it.
- Monday 28. The 26th Chapter of Exodus read and boys examined upon it.
- Tuesday 29. A holiday
- Wednesday 30. The boys in Standard V. Writing Practice are very imperfect.
- Thursday 31. Gave the IV Standard a dictation lesson.
- Friday 1. June. To day the IV & V Standards had examples to write in the simple rules, to test their quickness and accuracy.
- Monday 4. A portion of the Book of Exodus gone through.
- Tuesday 5. The ninth Chapter of St. Luke gone through.
- Wednesday 6. The writing in Standard I had. This must have more attention.

June 1866.

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- Thursday 7. A Scripture lesson ~~to~~ our Lord sending his disciples out to preach.
- Friday 8. The Tables in weights and measures imperfect in the IV Standards. I never had so much trouble to get lads to learn them.
- Monday 11. Standards IV & V Read the 27th, 28th Chapters of Exodus. Boys in Standard I read their books pretty well.
- Tuesday 12. The morning very wet, only a few boys, which has interfered with the lessons.
- Wednesday 13. Tried the IVth Standard in large sums in Compound Multiplication. All except the exceedingly dull ones were correct.
- Thursday 14. Examined the III Standard in Simple Addition and Subtraction. They are not accurate in either rule.
- Friday 15. The boys in Standards IV and V and pretty well up in Notation as far as hundreds in Millions.
- Monday 18. Gave Standard III a lesson in Notation lesson as far as hundreds in thousands.
- Tuesday 19. Many boys in Standard III and very dull in answering in Scripture.
- Wednesday 20. The Spelling in Standard III much improved. They have lessons every day in Spelling.

- Thursday 21. Nothing specially to note.
- Friday 22. All lessons gone through which have been given this week.
- Monday 25. A portion of the Book of Genesis gone through. Many boys have a very fair knowledge of it.
- Tuesday 26. The 4th Standard commenced Compound Division.
- Wednesday. Standards I, III, IV, V, VI. finished their reading books to day.
- Thursday 28. Broke up to this morning for the Midsummer holidays.

30th July 1866

- Monday. Commenced the 2nd half this day with 56 boys.
- Tuesday 31. A very wet morning and few boys in attendance. Lessons interfered with.
- August
- Wednesday 1. Went through the examples in Arithmetic with Standard III. Many of the boys seem to have forgotten their tables. This Standard wants a good to make it up to the mark.
- Thursday 2. The Spelling of the IV Standard is bad. John Dalton does not appear to be able to spell the best words.
- Friday 3. The ^{day} has been rough and rainy. Only a few boys present.

August 1866

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- Monday 6. The anniversary of the village Club to day. Nearly all the children were absent. Half a holiday.
- Tuesday 7. The III Standard with the II had notation as far as Units in thousands.
- Wednesday 8. Heard all the classes read to day. Most of the boys read fairly. The Arithmetic in the IV Standard is imperfect.
- Thursday 9. Heard the IInd & IV Standards read to day. Several boys in these Standards read very imperfectly.
- Friday 10. Heard the Catechism to day. Some of the boys have forgotten this during the holidays.
- Monday 13. Finished going through the Book of Genesis the second time.
- Tuesday 14. The 14th Chap: of S^c Luke given to Standards III. IV. V. Boys in Standard III wrote notation as far as hundreds in thousands.
- Wednesday 15. Found the boys in Standard III improved in dictation: Ine Dalton is improved in spelling.
- Thursday 16. Only Ine Dalton. Tho^s: Rotherham right in his sums which were taken home last night. All can do them readily orally on the Blackboard.
- Friday 17. All lessons had during the week reviewed.

August 1866.

- Monday. 20. There were many boys late this morning. The IVth Standard commenced Compound Division this half year.
- Tuesday. 21. Reviewed the old lessons in the Old Testament History. The boys Tho^s Berry and Henry Shaw the worst answers.
- Wednesday. 22. Spent a good deal of time this afternoon in examining W^m Roughley relative to a theft which it was said he had committed in the Girls School. He was found guilty and punished, and made to restore the Key stolen.
- Thursday. 23. Heard the IV Standard Read to day. There are only about 14 boys who can read correctly.
- Friday. 24. The IV. V. VI Standards are imperfect in their Tables of Weights and Measures.
- Monday. 27. Commenced the Book of Exodus to day.
- Tuesday. 28. The ^{Standard} IInd commenced Simple Subtraction.
- Wednesday. 29. Critic the III. IV Standards to put down numbers as far as time in thousands

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and found most of the boys able to do it.

- Thursday. 30. The day has been wet, and many boys have been absent.
- Friday. 31. The Standards went through all their old Rules in Arithmetic.
- Monday. 3. Compound Division is getting ^{on} poorly in the IV Standard. None of the boys can work it correctly.
- Tuesday. 4. The appearance of the boys with few exceptions has been slovenly. They were all told about it this morning.
- Wednesday. 5. Many boys had taken more pains this morning but there were others who came as before. These were kept in to write lines.
- Thursday. 6. The Lord appearing to Moses in the burning bush to the II. III. IV. V. VI. Standards.
- Friday. 7. The II. III Standards had the Church Catechism in the old School. The other Standards had a lesson on a portion of it ~~in the~~ under the Master.
- ~~October~~
Monday 10. Henry Shaw was sent home to day to change his clothes which he made very wet by jumping in the dam. Many others had been doing the same thing, these were warned.

September 1866..

- Tuesday 11. Many of the boys in Standards II & III do not appear to get on well in their reading the whole of which has been read through before.
- Wednesday 12. The Standards II & III were taken to day in notation as far as tens in thousands. Many of the boys understand it.
- Thursday 13. Dictated sums to the 4th Standard. James Benson, Joseph Lyon, and Ralph Asketh unable to put the numbers down.
- Friday 14. William Shreefall and William Shearman are not up with their tables (W. W) yet they were kept in to day.
- Monday 17. Reviewed the old Scripture lessons this morning.
- Tuesday 18. The III Standard had sums bearing on Division to day. Roughley and Aughton as usual had not the least idea of them.
- Wednesday 19. The I Standard can read their book fairly. They are also much improved in making their letters.
- Thursday 20. Exercised Stand I in counting up to fourteen and writing figures up to ten.

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- Friday 21. Gave Stand² IV.VI. a portion of the Creed. The other Standard had the text of the Catechism under a monitor in the old School.
- Monday 24. Many boys kept in to learn their Collect this morning. They come to school more cleanly.
- Tuesday 25. Stand² IV backward in dictation. John Dalton not improved in spelling.
- Wednesday 26. Gave the II Standard a sum in simple subtraction to day. 6 boys right & wrong.
- Thursday 27. Examined the III Standard to day as far as simple Multiplications. All with exceptions were right.
- Friday 28. Tried Stand² IV on paper with a sum in Compound Addition. Out of 7 boys in this Standard only two were right.
- October
- Monday 1. Reviewed the old Scripture lessons this morning with Stand III. IV.V. Many boys who attend regularly answer well.
- Tuesday 2. The boys in the lowest class who have been entered lately are not getting on very fast. I borrowed a reading card to say from the Girls School for them to learn.

October 1866

- Wednesday 3. The dication in Standards IV. V. is bad. Only three boys in both standards passed. The exercise contained some hard words.
- Thursday 4. Standard II was examined in reading. They all read fairly except one Foster.
- Friday 5. The III Standard did badly in their paper examination in Arithmetic.
- Monday 8. Noticed many boys absent to day. This is a busy time of year, when farmers are getting in the potato harvest and sowing corn, and there is much demand for boy labour.
- Tuesday 9. Gave II & III Standards an exercise in notation as far as hundreds in millions. Very few of the boys could do it.
- Wednesday 10. The boys in Standard one are getting on under the Monitors, both in reading and Arithmetic.
- Thursday 11. Tried Standard VI in Notation as far as hundreds in millions. Ralph Hesketh & James Benson could not do it at all.
- Friday 12. Exercised Standard VI in Notation.
- Monday 15. Began the Gospel of St. Luke the second time with Standards II. III. IV. V. VI.
- Tuesday 16. Exercised the Standard III in spelling.
