

The Reader Writes...

I write this on a sunny, windy Bank Holiday weekend – though I almost forgot that it was Bank Holiday weekend; as someone who rarely leaves the house due to lockdown restrictions, the days of the week are proving hard enough to hold onto, never mind the date and the Bank Holidays!

As we get into new routines, some of us are finding lockdown increasingly difficult; others have settled into some kind of routine. Some are bored; others frustrated; some angry. Some are desperate for things to return to normal; others think that things can't (or shouldn't) return to the way they were.

The Press have loved creating heroes and villains.

The villains were those – whether ordinary members of the public or politicians and political advisors – who felt that the restrictions didn't apply to them.

The NHS, care workers and other key workers have become the heroes – many of whom earn little and were not always afforded the respect they deserved. And who can forget Captain (Honorary Colonel, now Sir) Tom Moore? The inspirational 100 year old who came to symbolise humility, gratitude and resilience?

The hope that, **somehow**, God is in charge, even in these times, is what gives me hope for the future. Our faith does not make us immune to suffering. As Julian of Norwich said, "He (God) didn't say 'You shall not be disturbed, you shall not have torment, you will not be dis-eased'; but he said, 'You shall not be overcome.' All shall be well, and all shall be well and all manner of thing shall be well."

News From Your Parish Council

The Government have now issued the regulations that give local authorities greater flexibility in the conduct of meetings, including allowing members to attend remotely, and for public and press access to those meetings. These 'Regulations' (The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020) came into force on 4 April 2020

The next meeting of Halsall Parish Council will therefore take place on Wednesday 10th June 2020 at 7 pm using ZOOM and the agenda will be published on the www.halsallparish.com website at least 3 clear working days before the meeting is due to be held.

Please note that until such time as Government advice changes the Council will continue to hold remote meetings.

Members of the public who wish to attend should follow the

guidelines listed below.

Before the meeting:-

- 1. The Agenda will be placed on the website and on the notice board (if possible) as normal (i.e. with three clear days of notice).
- 2. Any member of the public and press who wishes to attend the meeting will need to download Zoom. Please visit https://zoom.us/meetings where you will be able to download the App. The website gives tutorials and demonstrations on how to download Zoom and how to join meetings.
- 3. The Clerk will put a link, on the website, to join the Zoom meeting by 5pm on the day of the meeting. The Clerk will also include the meeting ID and password. For the Planning Committee meetings the link will be posted by 5pm the evening before.
- 4. The Clerk will upload to the website the full set of papers (other than for the Planning Committee) to support the meeting the day before the meeting.

5. Members of the public are welcome (as usual) to send any questions or comments to the Clerk prior to the meeting via email to davebondhpc@aol.com or by calling the Clerk on 01704 534090. These must be received by 5pm on the day of the meeting. The Clerk will present any representations received to the Councillors to address.

The meeting:-

- 1. The Chair of the Council will Chair the meeting.
- 2. The Clerk of the Council will host the meeting on Zoom which will be recorded (please note that once the minutes have been approved at the next meeting the recording will be destroyed)
- 3. Members of the public will enter a "waiting room" on Zoom and wait for the Clerk to approve their attendance. It would be helpful if members of the public could "name their videos" so that the Chair and Clerk can refer to them correctly.
- 4. All attendees will be muted on entry to the meeting.
- 5. Members of the public will be able to make representation during the public forum.
- 6. Members of the public will be asked to "put their hand up" using the icon on Zoom if they wish to speak during the public forum.
- 7 The Clerk will "unmute" members of the public who wish to speak at the instruction of the Chair.
- 8. At the conclusion of the public forum the Clerk will "mute" all members of the public.
- 9. The required standards of behaviour and discussion are the same whether in remote or face-to-face meetings. Members of the public who use or display inappropriate or offensive language and/or behaviour will be removed from the meeting to the waiting room. This includes any inappropriate backdrops on display on the video.
- 10. The Council will discuss, via email, prior to the meeting any items which are considered sufficiently confidential as to warrant exclusion of members of the press and public under the provisions of The Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960 and will advise, if appropriate, of the outcome of any discussions at the meeting.
- 11. The Clerk will end the ZOOM meeting once business has been concluded.

After the meeting

- 1. The Clerk will take the minutes of the meeting as usual.
- 2. Members of the Council and the Clerk will review how the meeting went and may make some changes to the process if necessary.

Below is an example of one of the documents available to view on the Parish website. It is an inspection report of Halsall School undertaken on 3rd November 1930. Interesting to see all the practical lessons that were taking place at that time.

BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Local Education Authority: -

Lancashire a school in this district.

School Halsall C. of E.

Regd. No. E.20/248/3

Inspected on 3rd November 1930

REPORT BY H.M.L. MR. H.C. Morris

This school was re-organised in January, 1929, and now makes provision for its own senior children and for the senior children from three smaller schools in the neighbourhood, In addition to three senior classes (136 children) thus formed, there are two classes of juniors and one class of infants (104 children).

The Practical Instruction (including the practical work in Science) is given in the large dining hall where mid-day meals for about 150 children are cooked and served. This is an inconvenient arrangement: otherwise the conditions for teaching are convenient and sufficient for the present numbers.

Viewed as a whole the school is well directed. curriculum is sensibly related to the conditions of life in the locality. The teachers work well and the children show a healthy interest in school life. The Head-Master rightly takes a considerable share in the teaching. Nevertheless, it appears doubtful if the staff of six assistant teachers, one of whom is responsible for the Manual Instruction, is sufficient for the efficient working of the school as at present organised.

The curriculum for the senior children includes Gardening, Handicraft, Domestic Subjects, and the keeping of poultry and rabbits. The arrangements for the care of the livestock, in which girls and boys share, are satisfactory; as this activity develops more space will probably be required for the poultry. The garden is well cultivated and well stocked, and sound instruction in varied gardening practice is given. Nursery work, an outstanding feature of the garden, is particularly School No.248.

appropriate for a school in this district. The construction of such things as been successfully accomplished by the Handicraft classes. It is suggested that in future undertakings of this very useful type the actual construction should be less hurried in order that more attention may be given to the necessary incidental instruction. It was noted at the inspection that many of the boys need more careful instruction in tool manipulation and simple bench work.

Apart from the foregoing remarks comments on the instruction of the senior classes are deferred.


The condition of the junior classes is promising. In the essential subjects the children are given opportunities for progressing according to ability and a creditable degree of attainment results. Speech Training is given on effective lines and the children are encouraged successfully to express themselves orally and in writing.

The Infants' Class is very well managed. The children enter with spirit into well directed activities, they speak and recite distinctly and, though it is hardly apparent that they are subjected to formal teaching, they make good progress in the rudimentary subjects.

It is understood that in future one of the teachers in the junior part of the school will be allowed to assume more definite responsibility for the co-ordination of the work of the classes of juniors and infants.

Draw on skills you have used in the past that have helped you to manage previous life's adversities and use those skills to help you manage your emotions during the challenging time of this outbreak.



Gardener's Corner

June at-a-glance

June is the month when the weather improves in leaps and bounds and so does the garden. Summer flowers make their first appearance; roses are in full bloom and powerful with scent. There's still lots to keep on top of in June – but don't forget to leave time to sit and enjoy the view.

Happy gardening.

General Garden Tasks

Water & deadhead plats regularly.

Remove perennial weeds.

Propagate roses & shrubs by taking softwood cuttings

Keep on top off training climbing & rambling roses & tie in clematis.

Layer clematis.

Prune Clematis Montana if necessary.

Continue to clip privet & other fast growing hedges.

Dig up tulip & hyacinth bulbs when foliage dies off & store dry bulbs in a cool dry, dark dry place ready to replant in autumn.

Plant out summer bedding plants.

Sow winter & early spring plants in trays under glass.

Water & feed containers & hanging baskets regularly.

Continue planting green-house grown frost-tender vegetables outside.

Transplant leek & brassica seedlings.

Keep all fruit trees well watered in dry weather.

Thin heavy crops of plums, apples, & pears.

Prune fan-trained apple or pear trees if necessary.

Harvest rhubarb & strawberries.

Continue to pot up rooted cuttings.

Take cuttings from fuchsias & pelargoniums.

Continue pollinating melons & remove male flowers from cucumbers.

Watch out for

Lily beetle.

Blackspot, powdery mildew & rust on roses.

Blackfly on broad beans.

Moles.

Plants in their Prime

Roses. Clematis. Potentilla. Philadelphus. Geranium (hardy). Hostas. Bearded iris. Alstromeria. Convolvulus. Cytisus. Cornus. Deutzia. Sambucus. Spirea. Hebe. Achillea. Anthmis. Campanula. Centurea. Corydalis. Delphinium. Lamium. Nepeta. Persicaria. Tiarella. Veronica. Verbascum. Aquilegia. Dianthus. Lathyrus.


