will be exalted in the earth...*

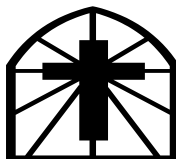
The Lord Almighty is with us;

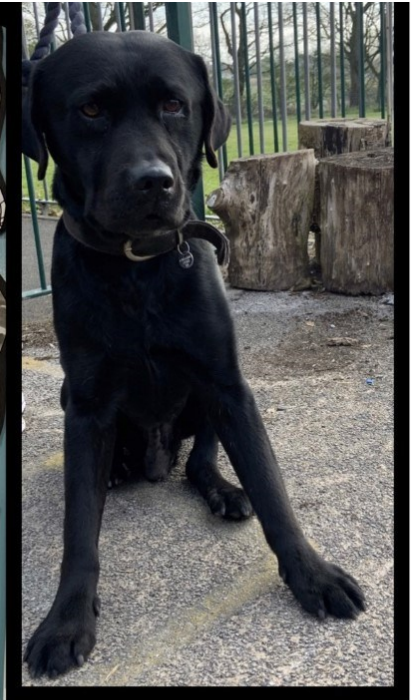
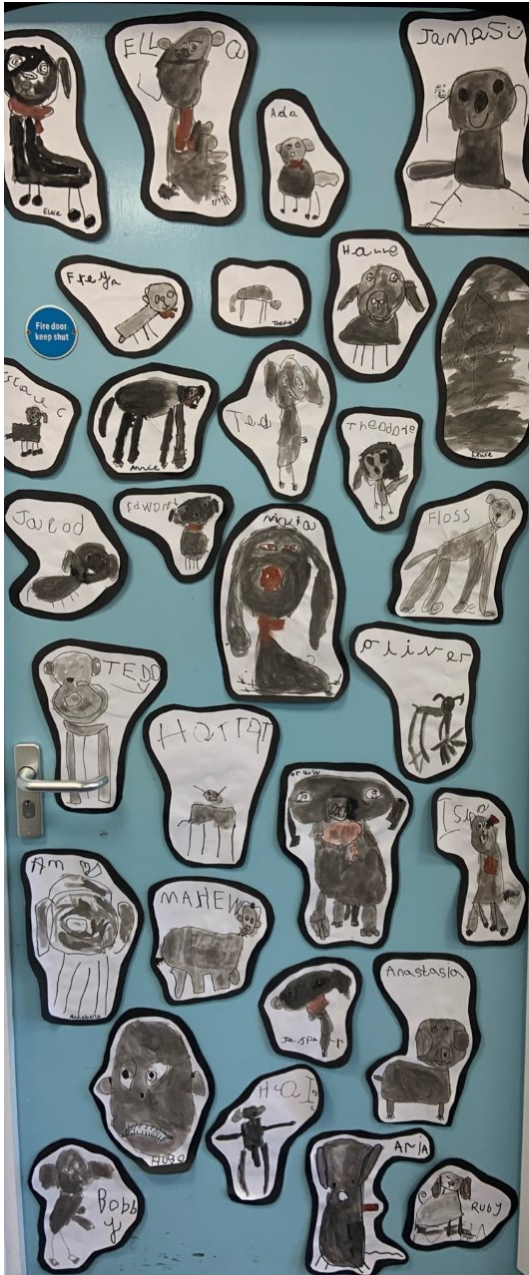

Lancashire Best Kept Village Competition 2021

Halsall is once again entered into this competition and after getting a runner-up place last time, we are hoping to go one better this year.

The Competition has been in existence for over 60 years and has encouraged community effort involvement to bring about a high standard of maintenance and care in Lancashire villages.

What's it all about?

Recognising villages that have put effort into making their village look its best and encouraging people to take pride in where they live.

How does the competition work?

There are five categories, and Halsall falls within the Large Village Class.

Two sets of judges (ordinary members of the public) visit each of the villages twice during June and July and award marks on various items.

The villages with the highest sets of marks will receive a further visit from committee members in the second round of judging.

Two villages with the highest marks will go forward to the final judging stage in August.

In addition to an award for the whole village, certificates are given for outstanding features such as churches, schools, pubs, public gardens,

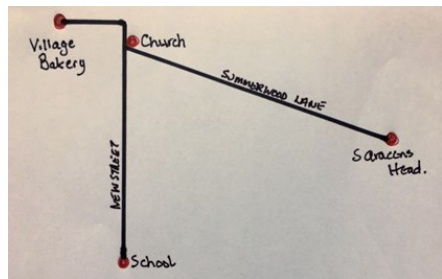
**This year there will be a theme -

Gleanings from the Parish News 1975-1985

In September 1975 the parish newsletter was relaunched in a different format. Previously it was available to buy and contained a portion of the Church Times; now it was free and included parish council news. It was delivered to every home in the ecclesiastical parish of Halsall and that included the northern edge of Haskayne. In the summer, a flower and crafts fair at the church had attracted 10,000 visitors and in 1977 the parish prepared for a special year. There was the silver jubilee of Elizabeth II, the Rose Queen and the flower festival. It was decided that the Queen's Silver anniversary should primarily be a celebration for the children of the parish and this became the task of the newly appointed head teacher Doug Bonner, who had taken over in September 1976 to prepare the children for the event.

First of all there was the matter of making right the church roof. The roof above the chancel had been disfigured by damage, caused during theft of lead in February 1976. It had become increasingly difficult to have the roof insured because of repeated thefts. Canon Bullough was an effective fund raiser and parishioners responded to his appeals. The Rector also voiced fears that the Parish would in future have to merge. He would voice similar concerns later in the year over the demise of the Kings James bible and the prayer book. The Rose Queen day took place on the 6th July followed by the Queen Elizabeth's silver anniversary and after this The Halsall Festival on 17th July 1977 included, a concert by the Chester Singers, a parish cricket match and a miss Halsall competition. The festival service in the morning was addressed by the bishop of Liverpool. A week of activities included a fashion show and a children's pet competition. It was a busy and interesting time for the people of Halsall but in the same month the east window of the church was broken in several places and the water tap in the graveyard was vandalised. Funds were raised and the windows were shielded with reinforced glass of the type used on Concorde the supersonic aircraft. Further problems came with Dutch Elm disease and 20 Elms in the churchyard were infected and later felled. The church still continued to be unlocked during the day but threat of increasing thefts was beginning to make the PCC review security .

Despite this Halsall's year turned shining again when, in October The Best Kept Village award was won by Halsall. Not only did Halsall win but they took the prestigious first place in the champions class which was the highest merit. Again events went topsy turvy when tragedy struck the village. Late in October Kathy Moores the young bride of David Moores died in a freak car accident on the moss. She was buried under the blossom tree in the churchyard only 26 years old.

The next year 1978 started with an appeal from Edward Carr the Choirmaster for choristers and this was successful with new members in all sections of the choir.

Jack Huyton took on the responsibility of Churchwarden from Bob Heaton and Christine Rigby was crowned Rose Queen. In 1979 Harry Sergeant after several years faithful service stood down from churchwarden and John Grimshaw was appointed. The Rose Queen that year was Sally Critchley. Olga Baxter retired from the position of Deputy Head at the school after many years sterling service. Farming was in the news when William Stopforth was awarded the British Empire Medal for services to agriculture. In November Ormskirk Music society gave a concert at the church and plans were made to stage a medieval weekend in the coming year with the re-enactment of a battle from the civil war by the sealed Knot heritage company.

Canon Bullough started the new decade by quoting the prayer of St Francis of Assisi paraphrasing Margaret Thatcher who had been elected Prime Minister 6 months earlier. Later he would denounce the demise of religion in schools and falling standards by quoting Pink Floyd's 'Brick in the wall' as an example of subversive attitudes. The early 1980's were punctuated by a series of thefts and vandalism from the church roof. In May 1982 the North side of the chancel was stripped of lead. In July 1980 Rose Queen was Sally Hirst. Christine Webster was followed by Diane Webster as Rose queen in 1981/2 respectively.

In 1983 the store sheds were burgled and the lawn mower was stolen .August 1983 saw restoration work on the reredos, the Halsall/Stanley tomb the George III coat of arms and the ancient text under the clerestory window. The candlesticks given by Hilda Lethbridge were also refurbished.

In September 1984 the rector wrote "The coal strike and the dock strike are destroying so many hopes for the future" In November 1984 Canon Bullough celebrated 25 years as Rector of Halsall and in his speech he warned of a 'Mrs Beeton compendium of liturgical anarchy' facing the church with various alternative orders of service. The PCC had stuck firmly to the traditional prayer book service and this had been firmly endorsed in 1980 when the PCC decided that the ASB alternative Service Book would not be introduced.

The Halsall WI played host to Dr Bird in November 1984 who regaled the women with tales of Halsall. He claimed that workmen working on one of the pillars in the 1920's had discovered treasure, 'a shower of gold coins' which were sold at Christies Auction House in London. No record of this 'find' is documented!

In May 1985 The Bishop Charles Claxton formerly Rector of Halsall revisited the church for Rogation Sunday. He visited local farms on the Rogation list. It was as a dedication to him that refurbishment of the reredos had been commissioned earlier.

Gardener`s Corner

May at-a-glance

May is, for me, one of the most exciting & loveliest months of the year in the garden, because you can see new flowers opening every time you step outdoors & the best of the year is still to come. Longer evenings and warmer weather brings out the gardener in all of us. Happy gardening.

General garden Tasks

Prepare the soil for bedding plants.

Keep on top of weeding & hoeing –its endless I know!

Watch out for and deal with pests using biological controls & organic remedies.

Feed established lawns if not done in April.

Pinch out any green shoots appearing on variegated trees & shrubs.

Tie in new growth of climbers & wall shrubs.

Clip beech, hornbeam, box & Leyland cypress late this month or early next. Cut privet.

Support perennials.

Divide clumps of primroses & polyanthus after flowering.

Continue deadheading & feeding spring-flowering bulbs.

Plant & train sweet peas. Plant tubs, troughs, window boxes & hanging baskets in the middle of this month at the earliest.

Sow swede, beetroot, maincrop carrots, peas, raddish & spring onion.

Direct-sow frost-tender vegetables, e.g. French & runner beans, sweetcorn & courgettes.

Plant out leeks.

Harvest overwintered onions.

Water soft fruit bushes with swelling fruit & newly planted fruit trees.

Protect strawberries from birds.

Continue to prick out seedlings, young plants & cuttings.

Continue hardening off bedding plants ready for end of month outdoor planting.

Plant tomatoes in early may & sweet peppers, chillies, melons & cucumbers late May.

Harvest baby potatoes.

Divide overgrown waterlilies in the pond.

Introduce new fish to the water garden now the weather is warmer.

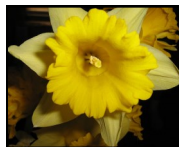
Watch out for

Late frosts – protect with fleece.

Pests in the greenhouse & containers.

Plants in their Prime

Rhododendrons. Clematis `Nelly Moser`. Clematis Montana. Viburnum. Dianthus. Wisteria. Euphorbia. Geum. Lonicera. Corydalis. Rosa `Lutea`. Tree peonies. Chaenomeles. Cotoneaster. Kerria japonica. Potentilla. Sambucus Nigra. Spiraea. Caellia.
