
8th May 2025 is 80th Anniversary of VE Day (1945 End of WW2 in Europe)

The Rector Writes



Here we are again at that beautiful time of year, when we can sense new life emerging and the longer, brighter days encourage us to look up and out. The work that has been done by the 'butterflies and bees brigade' and 'proud and tidy teams' are clear for all to see. Yet at the moment, the wider world seems a harsh and unforgiving place.

Some of you reading this will be able to remember the Second World War. Sadly, 80 years on, we see conflict and violence enacted in more parts of the world than ever. The First World War was supposed to be 'the war to end all wars', and in the aftermath of the Second World War, the nation's came together to write a body of International Law that would protect human rights, protect civilians caught in armed conflict, and ensure that genocide could not happen again: we are probably all left wondering what went wrong? There are no easy answers, but part of our response should be to intentionally remember and, in doing do so, bring the past into the present; and where we can, bring hope and reconciliation. It's something we can all choose to do and its importance in building community cannot be over emphasised.

In bringing the past into the present we need to take care. In a context where many people are traumatized and angry we need to speak gently. We need to try to build each other up, as is happening with Southport after the tragic events of last summer, and in smaller ways with the VE celebrations and the "growing together" weekend in May here in Halsall.

Building a more Christ-like world means recognizing our common humanity and accepting that none of us is perfect or has all the answers. In standing with Jesus, the victim of appalling violence, we also stand with him in the resurrection, the total antithesis of destruction and death.

It is an amazing if profoundly disturbing way to try and live. Why not join us at one of our services over the coming month, and take time to ponder what it would mean for you, your family and our communities to work towards such a Christ-like world.

Halsall Parish Council elected Mr Paul Barker of New Street as a **Co-opted Parish Councillor** at a meeting on 12th March. Thank you to all the applicants that showed an interest.

A few days later Council Andy Timon resigned so there is another **Councillor vacancy**. 10 Residents have until 8th April to ask WLBC to arrange a By-Election. If a By-Election is not requested, then the Council will fill the vacancy by written applications. Please contact the Parish Clerk for application forms after 9th April.

The Council approved a £300 grant to Shirdley Hill Community Association to help organise an **80th Anniversary Commemoration of VE Day**. This will be a village fete on Shirdley Hill Green Village on Sunday 4th May starting from 2pm (See event advert of Page 3) and a Beacon lighting ceremony led by Rev. Salt on Thursday evening 8th May.

Halsall West End Cricket Club applied for a £500 grant to replace ground maintenance equipment. Any voluntary organisations looking for a grant for 2025/26 should contact the Parish Clerk.

The Council has contributed £1128 to the cost of producing the **Halsall News** magazine for 2024.

Damaged road signs on New Cut Lane and Gregory Lane have been repaired following recent reports made on Love Clean Streets App. <u>www.lancashire.gov.uk/roads-parking-and-travel/report-it/report-it-on-the-go/</u>. You can send a photo of a pothole, or a damaged sign, mark it on a map and you receive a reply when it is fixed.

There is a major LCC highways project to **replace all temporary pothole fixes** along the 4+ mile length of A5147 (Gorsuch Lane, Halsall Road, New Street, Southport Road etc) all the way down to Maghull, Sefton boundary. This should include a full resurface of the Gregory Lane mini roundabout. Work should have been completed on 28th March.

The Parish Council Website now <u>halsallparish.gov.uk</u> has been updated to the latest .gov.uk standards. Content now includes more documents, financial records, agendas and minutes of meetings. There is also a new What's On section showing current bookings at the Memorial Hall and St Aidan's Hall. Now easier to find opportunities for one-off party bookings at £15 per hour or new regular event bookings at £10 per hour.

Following comments on Facebook about HGVs using canal bridges the Canals and Rivers Trust were asked for dates of recent bridge inspections and safe weight limits; Morris Lane 2017 - 44 Tonnes; Northmoor Lane 2020 - 40 Tonnes; Summerwood Lane 2019 - 40 Tonnes.

I DIDN'T KNOW THERE WAS A BOWLING GREEN THERE !

This is something we hear so often from visitors & locals when they discover there is a bowling green at the Saracen's Head.

Admittedly, over recent years, the green has been surrounded by tall hedges, so not obvious that we are here. We are hoping to change that by reducing the height of the hedges and creating a 'window' through which people can see the green.

There has been a bowling green at the Saracen's Head for many years. A brief search of old maps show that the area currently occupied by the green is marked as far back as 1873, although neither the pub or green are actually named. What we can tell you is that the green was definitely in use in 1956, when the Saracen's Head Bowling Club was established.



The official opening of the club took place on Saturday 14th July 1956 by President George Lydiate & Chairman Edwin Stephenson.

Since then the club has hosted thousands of league games, countless competitions and has been supported by hundreds of members over the years.

The Bees and Butterflies Brigade (April 2025)

A mid-summer garden full of butterflies is a true delight and the most common UK species do well because they are able to feed and breed on plants that grow in gardens. Now, 80% of our butterfly species are in decline, drastically threatened by habitat loss, climate change and pollution. They need our gardens more than ever.

If you have a garden, whatever the size, you can make an enormous difference to butterflies by growing a few choice plants on which they can stock up on nectar. This will give them the energy they need to find a mate or enter hibernation. Plants like native primrose, aubretia, lungwort, honesty, English bluebell, and forget-me-not provide nectar for butterflies early in the year. Later, wallflower, hebe, purple-topped vervain, ice plant and Michaelmas daisy are all magnets for butterflies.

Growing buddleia, the aptly named "Butterfly Bush" is one of the best ways to support butterflies from late summer onwards. To make the most of your buddleia, cut it right back (by about two-thirds) in March or early April. This way it will bloom in late-summer, in time for the emergence of the most colourful butterflies – Red Admiral, Peacock, Tortoiseshell and Comma. Dead head your plant immediately after flowering to promote a second flush of blooms. Then cut it back by half in November to prevent strong winds from damaging the plant. It will then provide a feast for your butterflies year after year.

It is not just nectar plants that butterflies need. They need plants on which to lay their eggs and which their caterpillars can eat before they pupate. The Orange Tip butterfly, for example, lays its eggs on Garlic mustard, which grows in Bishop's Walk. The Red Admiral, Comma and Small Tortoiseshell lay their eggs on nettles – but finding a patch of nettles in a safe, sheltered, sunny location is not so easy for them as it once was. If you have room for such a patch in your garden, think twice about the strimmer or the herbicide – those nettles could be the source of next year's beautiful butterflies.

The next meeting of The Bs will be on Sunday 27th April at 2pm in St Cuthbert's Memorial Garden. We will be continuing our planting of the woodland garden for bees, butterflies and other amazing wildlife.
