## **The Rector Writes**



I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow.

(from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 3: verses 6 and 7.)

Growing plants involves selecting a suitable location, preparing the soil, planting seeds or seedlings and then providing appropriate care, including watering, feeding and weeding. For gardeners, then, May is a busy month, ensuring precious plants are enabled to flourish.

Our faith is similar. In order for us to grow in faith, we need to feel safe enough to ask the big questions around how we make sense of our complex and confusing world. Ideas need to be planted and allowed to germinate in their own time, watered by prayer and worship. That is why we need to create safe spaces, where we can be honest and allow all to speak without fear of judgement or ridicule. We need to hear each other's stories with care and respect and ponder how we can enable all to flourish.

That is part of what St Cuthbert's "Growing Together" open weekend (from Friday May 9th to Sunday May 11th) is all about. We aim to make space to listen together and learn what God is doing in our community. It is about nurturing those seeds within each of us, enabling us all to flourish no matter what challenges we are facing.

**Annual Parish Meeting** is a historic legacy event. All parishes (council wards, not church areas) should organise an annual meeting of electors to discuss items that could be escalated to the Parish council. Here in Halsall it is taken as an opportunity for the various voluntary groups to give an account of their activities and plans. This year we will try a new idea of having the meeting at 7:00pm on 14th May at St Aidan's Hall, immediately before the Council meeting.

**Car parking on pavement**. Many of our lanes are narrow and motorists want to give as much space as possible for other vehicles but it is inconsiderate and unsafe to force pedestrians and especially prams into the road because there is no space on the pavement. Please park safely for everyone; you, your passengers, pedestrians and other road users.

**Potholes.** Hopefully the resurfacing of Gregory Lane mini roundabout will see an end to the persistent potholes in this location but if you see other ones developing then please report them as soon as possible via Love Clean Streets app on mobile phones. You can also report flooding on highways due to blocked gullies and damaged road signs.

Halsall Parish Council has agreed to a Section 137 grant of up to £600 for a Summer Fete on Recreation Ground on 14th August. More details to follow as events are organised.

### Lancashire Best Kept Village Competition

As well as entering our whole village centre into this year's



competition, we have entered 4 items in Halsall into the outstanding feature classes. This allows individual areas to be judged against similar features in other villages. This year we are entering the Church, the School, the Cricket Grounds and the Inter-active History Notice Board on the wall at the

Memorial Hall. Judging starts at the beginning of June for the 2025 competition and can continue right through until the end of August if we progress to the final rounds.



## What does the Parish Council do?

The Parish Council acts as the voice of the community. Although the PC has very little power itself, we raise community issues and concerns with borough, county councillors and other authorities so that they can take action. We work with St Cuthbert's Church to prepare content and distribute a monthly newsletter to keep the residents informed about what's going on, local groups active in the area and to give local businesses a place to advertise.

The Parish Council also has an important role in signposting individuals to appropriate borough and county council departments and services. We keep people informed about local planning applications and decisions.

The Parish Council owns and has responsibility for St Aidan's Hall in Shirdley Hill as well as being the sole Trustee for the Memorial Hall and playing field in Halsall. Both halls act as community warm hubs in winter and are available for hire to support a wide range of community activities and events. Members of the Parish Council organise regular activities such as the fortnightly lunch club and fund raising quiz nights at St Aidan's and children's craft, film and family fun events in the Memorial Hall. The PC provides small grants to support local community groups such as the Bees and Butterflies Brigade, Halsall Proud and Tidy, Friends of the Green and helps maintain Shirdley Hill Village Green.

Parish Councillors are not paid and work voluntarily. They take a leadership role in organising other volunteers, such as for the group of local residents who helped redecorate St Aidan's Hall. The only part-time paid posts are for the Clerk and Assistant Parish Clerk who undertake the formal duties such as preparing agendas, calling Councillors to monthly meetings, recording and publishing minutes and taking responsibility for banking and keeping the finances in order. It takes a surprising and huge amount of work and time to organise the hiring out of the two halls and take responsibility for their maintenance.

We'll also be making a simple wormery to highlight the incredible job that worms do to mix, aerate and enrich our soil – get ready for some dirty hands and fascinating worm facts!



Before that, you can join us for a fun and informative day on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> May, when we'll be proud to show you our churchyard planting and tell you our planting plans for the future.






