





The Rector Writes



How clean is your car? It can hardly be worse than mine. Sometimes this can be a blessing. Recently I was rummaging in the boot when I spotted an errant till receipt. It was dated 24th March this year, from the Tesco filling station in Porthmadog.

Suddenly I was transported back to the short break Neil and I had in Portmeirion. The first day was a bit grey and rather chilly, but this was followed by a couple of glorious sunny days as we enjoyed the beautiful scenery of North Wales and the immense pleasure of being looked after for a few days.

Ordinary things have the power to transport us to remarkable times and places. That is one of the reasons why St Cuthbert's inspires so many. It is not just the architecture, as impressive as it is, but the hymn book dedicated to a long dead relative. It is the ordinary as well as the extra-ordinary that can transport us beyond ourselves.

This is at the heart of our familiar sacrament of Holy Communion. A piece of bread that would normally pass us by as entirely mundane and uninteresting, is transformed into something that speaks of the eternal love of God, that opens the spiritual channel between us and God, that brings to mind the whole Gospel account of the sacrificial love of Jesus Christ. Another world opens for us in a small piece of bread and the merest sip of wine.

The incredible thing is that God can work the same way through each one of us. When we are attuned to the presence of God in our lives, we mere mortals become vessels in which the Holy Spirit finds a home and through which the light of Christ shines, to bring hope to the people we encounter. Each one of us has the potential to bring to life a world of love and hope as we go about our daily lives. That is at the heart of building community and was at the heart of our growing together weekend in May.

Thank you to all who joined us over the three days. We hope to be able to share the outcome of the community survey soon.



The parish council organised a **Parish Meeting** on 14th May and several voluntary organisations reported on their activities in the community. Minutes and copies of their reports will be available at <u>https://www.halsallparish.gov.uk/agendas-and-minutes/</u>.

The **Annual Council meeting**, on 14th May, voted Cllr Mary Lyons as Chair and Cllr Noel McCarthy-Thomason as Vice-Chair for the next 12 months.

The **Internal Auditor** has examined the Council's processes and accounts and their report, is available on the website. <u>https://www.halsallparish.gov.uk/financial-documents/</u>.

The annual audit process now moves to the External Auditor phase and the public right to view the Council's accounts will be from 3rd June to 14th July. Any questions can be raised with the Council and/or the External Auditor.

The Council approved a **£600 grant to War Memorial Playing Field and Hall** charity to hold an August summer fair at the Recreation ground. Any voluntary organisations looking for a grant for 2025/26 should contact the <u>Clerk@HalsallParish.gov.uk</u>.

The Council has agreed to replace the two **defibrillator cabinets**, at Recreation ground and Heathey Lane bus stop, in service since 2013, as the keypads have become defective, at a cost of £978.

Halsall Parish Council will be voting on a **new co-opted councillor** at 11th June meeting. (applications closed on 31st May)

Many potholes on A5124 were repaired in late March/Early April including a resurface of the Gregory Lane mini roundabout. The more potholes, blocked drains and damaged road signs that are reported on Love Clean Street App on your mobile phone, the more evidence there is for Lancashire Highways to come out and fix them. So please keep reporting any defects.

The Parish Council Website now **halsallparish.gov.uk** has been updated. Content now includes more documents, financial records, agendas and minutes of meetings. There is also a new What's On section showing current bookings at the Memorial Hall and St Aidan's Hall. Now easier to find opportunities for one-off party bookings at £15 per hour or new regular event bookings at £10 per hour.

The Bees and Butterflies Brigade June 2025

Thank you to everyone who helped with our plant sale and planting over the Open Church weekend in May. You are all so hard-working and supportive! Thank you to all those who bought plants, too – the money raised will help us with our autumn planting projects.

We have lots of reasons to be proud of all the planting we have achieved over the last eighteen months. Not only is it all looking healthy and attractive, but it's starting to pull in our pollinators and other insects. Here are some of the highlights from the Memorial Garden this spring......

In the dry, mossy areas under the trees, queens of Buff-tailed and White-tailed bumblebees have been flying low over the ground, looking for holes and tunnels where they can nest. They've been using aubretia and lungwort to stock up on nectar, too! In late April there were fledgling blue-tits fluttering around one of our bird boxes (as if it was their home) and I found ladybirds in quite large numbers emerging from dried leaves in our log piles and from under our ha-ha plants. Black beetles often scuttled away when I moved a log or stone – this is great news for hedgehogs because beetles are one of their favourite foods.

In the ha-ha, the ox-eye daisies have been growing strongly and seem to be dominating our wildflower planting this year. Wild carrot, hedge parsley, foxgloves and red campion can be seen, too, but other perennials are taking longer to establish and may not make their presence known until next year. The planting does look lush, though, making a mini-meadow where insects can hide, feed and lay their eggs.

Visits from Orange-tip and Speckled Wood butterflies have made me smile. Whilst a female Orange-tip looks very like a large white (white with black wing tips) the male Orange-tip is particularly beautiful because of the bright orange splash on his white wings. A Speckled Wood is quietly beautiful, with wings of buff and brown which help to camouflage it against bark and foliage. This butterfly usually flies in partly-shaded woodland with dappled sunlight, and I've seen them on shady parts of the canal as well as in the churchyard. Whilst neither of these butterflies are species of conservation concern at the moment, the numbers of both species have dropped significantly since 2019 according to UK monitoring programmes like "The Big utterfly Count". It's fantastic that our planting is supporting them because butterflies are doing well, too. If you'd like to find out more about UK butterflies and moths, the charity "Butterfly Conservation" has a lovely website where you can find plenty of pictures and key information.

If you have time, choose a sunny afternoon and take a moment to sit quietly beside our wildflowers – it won't be long before nature will reward you.

Friends of the Green (FROGs) annual report 2025

The Shirdley Hill Green is the heart of the village, and the FROGs have had a busy time making several improvements during this year.

The pond is looking good with plenty of water lilies and other waterside plants emerging. Every year we remove some of the bullrushes to prevent them taking over.

Floods took their toll over winter and we lost a couple of trees. We added bark chips to the wild paths and will need to add more again this year to keep them in good order. The raised beds helped mitigate the impact of the flooding. The newly planted raised bed for the shrubbery did very well last year, with bulbs and wildflowers added between the shrubs to fill the space and provide colour until the shrubs are better established. The wildflower patch was also flooded, and a new raised bed was constructed in this area and filled with a donation of topsoil from local farmer Roy Webster. This has been seeded up with good quality wildflower seeds.

The new corner plot is taking shape and the rose and lavender raised bed is doing well with several new good quality David Austin roses planted last year.

Weeds are a constant problem, and we do our best to keep them under control. The sensory plot had a major problem with equisetum (Mare's tails), but we have managed to reduce the impact of these persistent weeds in this area, just by constant removal. The grasses plot, the fernery and other raised beds are looking good and have done well.

Moles are a constant problem on the Green. The mole soil is collected and used, but the molehills can be unsightly until this can be done. James Forshaw does a great job mowing the grass and cutting the hedges.

The birdboxes were well used last year and have all been cleaned out ready for use this year. The log piles provide a haven for the wildlife in the undisturbed wooded areas.

The compost system continues to provide plenty of mulch and nutrients for the flower beds, pots and around the trees.

The 'twigwam' was removed as much had died and was unwieldy. New willows whips have been planted around the base in the hope that they will eventually provide enough growth to create a new canopy next to the pond.

A large Christmas tree was donated by local residents. The Parish Council assisted with funding for lights and about a hundred members of the village came together to celebrate switching on the lights, sing a few carols and enjoy traditional fare. We have recently enjoyed two major events around VE-Day.

The Green is well used by families coming for a picnic for organised event or to play football but especially by the elderly and dog walkers. The pavements in the village are in a poor condition, and the Green provides a safe place for people to walk and exercise.

In the Lancashire Best Kept Village competition, we came top in the garden category.

We have had a busy year, and have achieved a lot, but we could do with more help, so if anyone is able to come along and join us, you would be most welcome. We meet at 9:30am every Tuesday and Friday, unless it is pouring with rain and we work throughout the year.
