Feedback from Growing Together weekend Friday 9th to Sunday 11th May 2025

Thank you to everyone who helped with or came to our weekend of "growing together". Thank you, too, to those who completed our community questionnaire. The results are being processed, and we hope we can share the headlines with you in the September Halsall News. Here is some initial feedback:

The children from school told us they would like the church to have more colour, better heating, soft seats, different songs, sparkles, and of course, more cake and sweets. However, many also said they liked it as it was, with one saying it was perfect. Another said when they went to church, they like to look for God.

Other initial suggestions included:

- A monthly after-school Lego club for families, in the Choir vestry at church.
- Expanding the existing Church Coffee Morning to a weekly event, to include craft as well as chat. To start from 9am, so parents could have a space to enjoy coffee and a chat with each other after school drop off and meet some of the other villagers.
- More All-Age Family Services in school. With Church Without Walls and Messy Church already happening on the 1st and 3rd Sunday mornings of each month, could an All Age afternoon service be fitted in on one of the other Sundays?
- Using the church more often for talks and music concerts.

What do you think? What would you like to see? If we work together, maybe we can build something truly inspirational for all.



The Rector Writes

In Charlie Mackesy's beautiful story, "The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse," we are invited into a world shaped not by answers, but by presence: by kindness, by love, by the gentle work of being with one another. It's a simple tale, filled with simple truths, but something about it lingers in the heart. Each character brings something different: the boy with his wondering, the mole with his sweet simplicity, the fox with his silence and trust, and the horse with his strength and wisdom. Together, they create a space where no one has to perform, fix, or impress; a space where just being together is enough.

There's a moment in the story where they sit quietly beneath the stars. No one speaks, yet everything is being said. And in that moment of shared stillness, truth doesn't need to be taught - it is simply known. Not imposed. Not explained. Just received.

The Church offers a similar invitation: "Will you continue to search and be open to the possibility of faith?" "Will you stay with the silence, and allow the Spirit to speak in ways words can't?" "Will you stay with the mystery, rather than rushing to explain it away?" For when we dare to do that, amazing things can and do happen. Strangers become friends, and we find that love is always enough. Just like "The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse," we too can sit under the stars and become aware of being loved. As Christians we are asked to live, however imperfectly, lives shaped by that love given and received. We are asked to listen. To trust. To dwell.

Whatever your plans this summer, I hope you will be able to find some time to discover the power simply of being.





The End of the Barton Rose Queen

Barton in Downholland is a rural hamlet and was the only part of Downholland that featured in the Doomsday book. Like countless other little villages, Barton has seen a decline over the years. It had a bank, a pub, a smithy, a shop, a railway station, a wharf on the canal, a mission church, several small farms and a Rose Queen festival. All have now gone. A few of the larger tenanted farms still remain. When the Rose Queen festival started in 1932 the 'Altcar Bob', which ran on the Cheshire Lines railway still picked up passengers at Barton station to take them to Southport.

Barton was geographically separate from the bigger village of Halsall, to which it was ecclesiastically connected with a mission church. The hamlet was also a quarter of a mile from Haskayne, a growing village, which became the civil parish centre of Downholland. The highlight of the year in Barton was the Rose Queen festival which was a whole village effort that brought young and old together and was a source of pride because it was done so well.

The pageant was reminiscent of a Thomas Hardy pastoral scene. By the end of the 1950's several factors were coming into play to dismantle the rural idyll of this small close knit agricultural community. The expansion of field sizes associated with large scale farming, meant that smaller farms were gobbled up and there were fewer family farm buildings so the population decreased. The railway which had still operated for freight was closed in 1957. The rise in motor vehicle ownership meant people could more often go out of the village to seek entertainment. There was more competition from alternative rural shows, school bazaars and carnivals. During this decade television ownership increased and this encouraged people to stay in. There was also the beginning of an awareness of the role of females in pageants and beauty contests, which made some uncomfortable about the objectification of young girls Though it was a small village fete, it was costly to run and demanded a great effort by the residents and organisers, to make the day happen. It took considerable time, dedication and planning and a lot of this responsibility fell on Annie McCoy, who with the backing of the church enthused both children and adults to work tirelessly towards Rose Queen day. The Rose Queen festival was a unique event in the life of the village, there was an innocence to it but also a naivety.

By 1960 the writing was on the wall, there was no Rose Queen that year. The church had only a temporary priest when Reverend Claxton moved on. The next rector Reverand Herbert Bullough came to Halsall, St Cuthberts in November 1959, but the mission had had no priest and fewer services. An effort was made to reinstate the Barton festival in 1961. However, in 1962 the Barton Rose Queen was crowned in a dual ceremony at Halsall and there was no Barton festival. In 1963 the Halsall Rose Queen festival took their procession to the Bluebell pub to share their festival but no Barton Queen was crowned. In 1965 tragedy struck when Barton mission was destroyed by fire and Barton Rose Queen was consigned to history.

Barton Rose Queen festival was a unique snapshot of rural life between and after the World Wars. It set a standard for other festivals because everybody supported it and built a special sense of community. It had commitment from farmers and families and gave a role to everyone who wanted take part and it was followed in this way by other villages. It existed in a bubble of self-sufficiency and lasted for 30 years and brought the community away from the austerity of the war years.




There's lots going on for The Bees and Butterflies Brigade in the next couple of months! Do come along and join us for any of these fun community events.


